FY2013 Adopted Budget

GENERAL FUND

The General Fund accounts are used to finance the fundamental operations of the City. This fund covers all activities for which a separate fund has not been established. The City's principle sources of revenue are property taxes, sales and use taxes, franchise fees, licenses and permits, and fines and forfeitures.

EXPLANATION OF BUDGET PURPOSE AND PROCESS

One of the vital functions of the City Manager is to establish and maintain internal control procedures designed to ensure that the assets of the City are protected and used efficiently. These internal controls include a budget (required by state law) which ensures that adequate accounting data is compiled to allow for the preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

- ¹ Includes Finance, Legal Services, City-wide management and operation costs, Information Technology, Human Resources and Library operations. Library employees' salaries are funded by Brazoria County. The City pays all library operating expenses.
- ² Community Development includes: Permits & Inspections, Health & Environmental Services and Planning.
- ³ Public Works includes: Fleet Services, GIS, Streets & Drainage, and the Service Center. Water and Sewer services are in the Enterprise Fund.
- ⁴ Engineering & Capital Projects includes GIS Mapping and Traffic Operations & Maintenance.
- ⁵ Parks and Recreation includes: the Recycling Center, maintenance of City facilities, custodial services, and maintenance of parks, medians and rights-of-ways.
- ⁶ 2012 and 2013 draw down of fund balance to fund non-recurring capital purchases.



General Fund Expenditures

Adopted General Fund expenditures for FY2013 total \$58,575,184. The FY2013 Adopted Budget represents an increase of \$5,562,484 from the projected expenditures for FY2012 and are \$6,238,977, or 11.9 percent more than the FY2012 Amended Budget. Financial Disclosure Statement

The financial information in this report is derived from the FY2013 Budget. Detailed financial information is available in the FY2013 budget document at the City Secretary's office, the Tom Reid Library and online at cityofpearland.com.

Fund Highlights – (All information is from the General Fund unless otherwise noted.)

- Funding for the opening of the West Side Library which is anticipated to open in April 2013.
- Parks improvements/enhancements funded at \$269,500.
 \$187,923 of which is funded from the Parks Development Fund to repair and replace equipment and landscaping.
- \$437,000 funded for sidewalk replacement and \$600,000 for asphalt road rehabilitation and repairs of more than 35 Cityroads.
- Funding for a ladder fire truck, a fire pumper, one ambulance, and the refurbishment of an existing ambulance.
- Continuation of grant funding for 6 full-time firefighters.
- \$116,000 budgeted for contracting mowing of medians on Pearland Parkway and Dixie Farm Road.
- Net increase of 12 full-time and 1 part-time staff including: 6 Police Officers, 1 Jailer and 1 Records Clerk in the Police Department, 2 Health Code Inspectors and 2 Water & Sewer services personnel.
- Replacement of aging data and phone systems at various City facilities to Voice Over IP.
- Improvements, rehabilitation and repairs at Water and Wastewater Plants funded at \$285,550 in the Water & Sewer Fund.
- \$145,262 in funding from HUD Community Development Block Grant for sidewalk and drainage in the Old Townsite.

Sales Taxes, primarily composed of a one cent local sales tax collection (from the City's General Fund), are estimated to increase from a projected \$14,363,666 in FY2012 to \$15,125,235 in FY2013, an increase of \$761,569 or 5.3 percent. The sales tax revenue has increased as the local economy improves.


The Pearland Economic Development Corporation also collects a half-cent local sales tax which is not reflected in the numbers above.

How the City Allocates Its Money (General Fund) - \$58.57 million



Pearland's property tax rate for Fiscal Year 2013 is \$0.7051. This is an increase from the FY2012 tax rate of \$0.6851 by \$0.02 for debt service. In past years, the debt component has increased due to an aggressive capital improvement plan, while the operating percentage of the tax rate has declined due to other revenue sources. Increase in the tax rate is consistent with the change anticipated in the 2007 bond referendum.
