Congressional Internship Program Overview

Congressman Kingston's internship program was established to provide students with an in-depth look at the American political process by learning how various entities formulate public policy and how other governmental agencies interact with that process. Interns will work closely with administrative, communications, district and legislative staff on numerous issues and projects. Furthermore, the internship offers students real world experiences where they can apply their classroom learning. During the internship, students will refine their career interests, develop leadership skills and gain a deeper understanding of American politics and history and the legislative process.

Please Note: Due to limited office salary resources, there are no paid internship positions available. All interns will serve in an unpaid status. In addition, interns are responsible for their living arrangements and all living costs during their internship.

- In an essay, please explain why you are interested in interning with Congressman Kingston's internship program; how it will enhance your education or career goals; and what contributions you feel you will be able to make to the Congressman's office. Your essay should be typed, double-spaced and 1,000 words or less.
- Resume and official college transcript
- One letter of recommendation
