\$25 Adult Explorer *In memory of the Native American explorers, who traveled the Athowominee through the Gap, before the year 1750. And, Dr. Thomas Walker, who in that year, traveled through and gave us the name, Cumberland Gap.*

\$30 The Family Axemen *(Includes all family members in household) In reference to Daniel Boone, and the 30 Axemen, who blazed The Wilderness Road in 1775.*

\$50 The Longhunter *Remembering those vanguards of settlement, like Daniel Boone and Elisa Wallen.*

\$100 The Packhorse *These beasts of burden, heavily-laden with deer hides worth a dollar each (hence, a dollar being called a "buck" today), transported a fortune in hides, east, out of the Kentucky paradise. Later, the packhorse would carry goods of up to 300,000 pioneers, west, to settle Kentucky.*

\$250 The Pioneer *In memory of the 250,000 to 300,000 of our ancestors who pushed through the Cumberland Gap between 1775 and 1810.*

\$500 The Legacy *Commemorating our devotion to our heritage, and the estimation of close to 50 million Americans today, having an ancestor that was one of the Cumberland Gap Pioneers.*

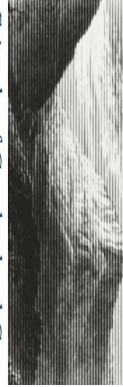

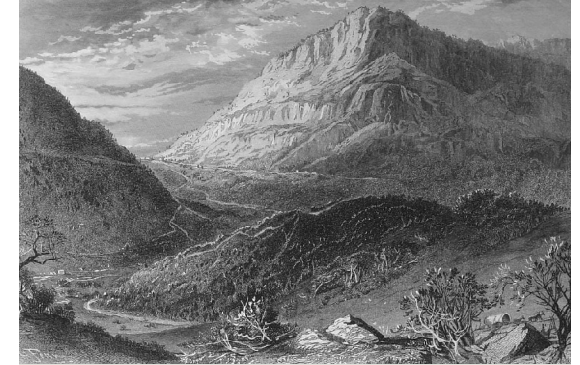

The Friends Story

Participants in the 2008-2009 Claiborne County (TN) Leadership Program developed a project to fulfill Leadership Program requirements. Because of their belief in community and with Cumberland Gap National Historical Park as a major part of their community, they wanted to find a way to give back to the park that offers so much. These became the building blocks for the Friends of Cumberland Gap. Claiborne County Leadership participants and others are already volunteering in the park, assisting with trail maintenance and other park projects. The Friends Group is a formal commitment, allowing them to support the park in a variety of capacities, including providing for the donation of funds and services to Cumberland Gap.

Why Cumberland Gap National Historical Park?

At Cumberland Gap, the first great gateway to the west, the buffalo, the Native American, the longhunter, the pioneer... all traveled this route through the mountains into the wilderness of Kentucky. Modern day explorers and travelers stand in awe at this great gateway and the many miles of trails and scenic features found in the park, which is located within the beautiful Tri-State Region of Claiborne County Tennessee, Bell and Harlan Counties in Kentucky, and Lee County Virginia.

You can follow the footsteps of early travelers along the Wilderness Road, experience the stories of the pioneer, the Civil War soldier, the traveler. Historic buildings and sites throughout the park provide opportunities to take a close look at the events that shaped a region and a nation.

Scenic vistas, cascading waterfalls, and lush forests excite the senses and provide the opportunity to experience the Southern Appalachians up close. The forests and streams of the mountains provide habitat for numerous species of plants and animals. Beneath the mountains lie miles and miles of subterranean passages. These caves are dark, wet worlds with unique geologic formations and animals that have adapted to survival in the underground. 80 miles of trails and numerous scenic areas provide the opportunity to explore the great outdoors!
