I move that House Bill 1323 be amended to read as follows:

1	Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new
2	paragraph and insert:
3	"SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-84 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
4	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2007]: Sec. 84. "Council" refers to
5	the following:
6	(1) For purposes of IC 16-21, the hospital council.
7	(2) For purposes of IC 16-25 and IC 16-27, the home health care
8	services and hospice services council.
9	(3) For purposes of IC 16-25.5, the dialysis facility council.
10	(3) (4) For purposes of IC 16-28 and IC 16-29, the Indiana health
11	facilities council.
12	(4) (5) For purposes of IC 16-46-6, the interagency state council
13	on black and minority health.
14	SECTION 2. IC 16-18-2-94.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
15	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
16	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2008]: Sec. 94.5. "Dialysis facility", for
17	purposes of IC 16-25.5, means an entity that provides therapeutic
18	or rehabilitative dialysis services required for the care of
19	individuals with renal disease.
20	SECTION 3. IC 16-25.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
21	A NEW ARTICLE TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
22	2008]:
23	ARTICLE 25.5. DIALYSIS FACILITIES
24	Chapter 1. Dialysis Facility Council

1 Sec. 1. (a) The dialysis facility council is established. The state 2 department shall staff the council. 3 (b) The council consists of nine (9) members appointed by the 4 governor as follows: 5 (1) Two (2) physicians, each of whom is: 6 (A) licensed under IC 25-22.5; and 7 (B) either: 8 (i) a qualified nephrologist; or 9 (ii) experienced in the care of patients with renal disease. 10 (2) One (1) registered nurse licensed under IC 25-23 and 11 experienced in the care of patients with renal disease. 12 (3) Two (2) individuals engaged in the administration of 13 facilities that provide dialysis services. 14 (4) One (1) individual engaged in hospital administration. 15 (5) The state health commissioner or the commissioner's 16 designee. 17 (6) One (1) representative of a statewide organization or 18 association that assists kidney patients. 19 (7) One (1) individual who is not associated with a hospital or 20 facility that provides dialysis, except as a consumer. 21 Sec. 2. (a) An appointment to the council is for four (4) years, 22 beginning July 1 of the year of appointment. However, in the case 23 of a vacancy, the appointee shall serve the remainder of the 24 unexpired term. A vacancy shall be filled from the group 2.5 represented by the outgoing member. (b) The governor shall appoint a chairperson from the members 26 27 of the council. 28 Sec. 3. A member of the council who is not a state employee is 29 entitled to the minimum salary per diem provided by 30 IC 4-10-11-2.1(b). A member is entitled to reimbursement for 31 traveling expenses provided under IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses 32 actually incurred in connection with the member's duties, as 33 provided in the state policies and procedures established by the 34 Indiana department of administration and approved by the budget 35 agency. 36 Sec. 4. (a) The first meeting of the council shall be called by the 37 chairperson and held not later than thirty (30) days after the 38 appointment of the members of the council. The council shall meet 39 at least two (2) times each calendar year on dates fixed by the 40 chairperson. 41 (b) Special meetings of the council shall be called by the 42 chairperson at the request of any three (3) members of the council. 43 (c) Five (5) members constitute a quorum for the transaction of 44 business. 45 Sec. 5. In the first meeting of the council and in the first annual 46 meeting during each subsequent year, the council shall elect from 47 the members a secretary who shall keep a record of all meetings.

1 The term of secretary is one (1) year. 2 Sec. 6. At the request of the council, the state department may 3 obtain the services of experts or other persons to assist the council 4 in the formulation of policy or in conducting the council's business. 5 Sec. 7. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the council shall 6 propose and the executive board may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 7 necessary to protect the health, safety, rights, and welfare of 8 patients, including the following: 9 (1) Rules pertaining to the licensure, operation, and 10 management of a dialysis facility. 11 (2) Rules establishing standards for equipment, facilities, and staffing required for efficient and quality care of patients of 12 13 a dialysis facility. 14 (b) The state department may request the council to propose a 15 new rule or an amendment to an existing rule necessary to protect 16 the health, safety, rights, and welfare of patients of a dialysis 17 facility. If the council does not propose a rule within ninety (90) 18 days of the state department's request, the state department may 19 propose the department's own rule. 20 (c) The state department shall consider the rules proposed by 21 the council and may adopt, modify, remand, or reject specific rules 22 or parts of rules proposed by the council. 23 Sec. 8. (a) The executive board may, upon recommendation by 24 the state health commissioner and for good cause, waive a rule 2.5 adopted under this chapter. 26 (b) Disapproval of a waiver request requires executive board 27 action. 28 (c) A waiver may not adversely affect the health, safety, rights, 29 or welfare of the patients. 30 Sec. 9. If a dialysis facility is part of a hospital, IC 16-21 applies. 31 Sec. 10. (a) Licensure inspections of a dialysis facility shall be 32 made regularly in accordance with rules adopted under this 33 chapter. The state department shall make all health and sanitation 34 inspections, including inspections in response to an alleged breach 35 of this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter. The division of 36 fire and building safety shall make all fire safety inspections. The 37 council may provide for other inspections necessary to implement 38 this chapter. 39 (b) An employee of the state department who knowingly or 40 intentionally informs a dialysis facility of the exact date of an 41 unannounced inspection shall be suspended without pay for five (5) 42 days for a first offense and shall be dismissed for a subsequent 43 offense. 44 (c) Reports of all inspections must be in writing and sent to the 45 inspected dialysis facility. 46 (d) The report of an inspection and records relating to the 47 inspection may not be released to the public until the conditions set

1 forth in IC 16-19-3-25 are satisfied. 2 Sec. 11. (a) The state department shall prepare an annual report 3 concerning dialysis facilities. The report must provide a consumer 4 with information concerning dialysis facilities in Indiana and 5 include the following: 6 (1) The location of each licensed dialysis facility and the 7 services provided at the facility. 8 (2) The inspection results of each dialysis facility. 9 (3) Any remedial or licensure action taken against a dialysis 10 facility. (4) Any other information the state department believes 11 12 would assist a consumer. 13 (b) The state department shall post the report required in 14 subsection (a) on the state department's Internet web site and 15 provide a written copy of the report to an individual upon request. 16 **Chapter 2. Licensure of Dialysis Facilities** 17 Sec. 1. (a) The state department shall license and regulate 18 dialysis facilities. 19 (b) A dialysis facility must be licensed by the state department 20 in order to operate in the state. 21 Sec. 2. The council may determine if a dialysis facility is covered 22 by this chapter. A decision of the council under this section is 23 subject to review under IC 4-21.5. 24 Sec. 3. The state department shall administer this chapter with 2.5 the advice of the council. 26 Sec. 4. (a) An applicant for a license under this chapter must 27 submit an application for a license on a form prescribed by the 28 state department showing that: 29 (1) the applicant is of reputable and responsible character; 30 and 31 (2) the applicant is able to comply with the minimum standards for a dialysis facility and with rules adopted under 32 33 this chapter. 34 (b) The submitted application must contain the following 35 information: 36 (1) The name of the applicant. 37 (2) The location of the dialysis facility. 38 (3) The name of the person to be in charge of the dialysis 39 facility. 40 (4) Other information required by the state department. 41 Sec. 5. An application for a license under this chapter must be 42 accompanied by a licensing fee at a rate adopted by the council 43 under IC 4-22-2. 44 Sec. 6. The state health commissioner may: 45 (1) issue a license upon receipt of the application without 46 further evidence; or 47 (2) request additional information concerning the application

1	and conduct an investigation to determine whether a license
2	should be granted.
3	Sec. 7. A license issued under this chapter:
4	(1) expires one (1) year after the date of issuance;
5	(2) is not assignable or transferable;
6	(3) is issued only for the premises named on the application;
7	(4) must be posted in a conspicuous place in the dialysis
8	facility for which the license was issued; and
9	(5) may be renewed each year upon the payment of a renewal
10	fee at the renewal rate adopted by the council under
11	IC 4-22-2.
12	Sec. 8. A dialysis facility that provides to a patient notice
13	concerning a third party billing for a service provided to the
14	patient shall ensure that the notice:
15	(1) conspicuously states that the notice is not a bill;
16	(2) does not include a tear-off portion; and
17	(3) is not accompanied by a return mailing envelope.
18	Chapter 3. Remedies for Violations
19	Sec. 1. The state health commissioner may take any of the
20	following actions on any of the grounds listed in section 2 of this
21	chapter:
22	(1) Issue a letter of correction.
23	(2) Issue a probationary license.
24	(3) Conduct a resurvey.
25	(4) Deny renewal of a license.
26	(5) Revoke a license.
27	(6) Impose a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed ten
28	thousand dollars (\$10,000).
29	Sec. 2. The state health commissioner may take action under
30	section 1 of this chapter on any of the following grounds:
31	(1) Violation of any of the provisions of this article or the
32	rules adopted under this article.
33	(2) Permitting, aiding, or abetting the commission of an illegal
34	act in a dialysis facility.
35	(3) Knowingly collecting or attempting to collect from a
36	subscriber (as defined in IC 27-13-1-32) or an enrollee (as
37	defined in IC 27-13-1-12) of a health maintenance
38	organization (as defined in IC 27-13-1-19) any amounts that
39 40	are owed by the health maintenance organization.
40	(4) Conduct or practice found by the council to be detrimental to the health sofety rights, and welfare of the patients of a

17	"SECTION 9. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) As used in this
18	SECTION, "council" refers to the dialysis facility council
19	established by IC 16-25.5-1-1(a), as added by this act.
20	(b) The governor shall make the initial appointments to the
21	council not later than July 1, 2008. In making the initial
22	appointment, the governor shall indicate the length of the term for
23	which the individual is appointed.
24	(c) Notwithstanding IC 16-25.5-1-2, as added by this act, the
25	initial terms of the members of the council, except for the state
26	health commissioner appointed under IC 16-25.5-1-1(b)(5), shall be
27	staggered as follows:
28	(1) Two (2) members of the council appointed for a term of
29 30	two (2) years.
30 31	(2) Three (3) members of the council appointed for a term of three (3) years.
32	(3) Three (3) members of the council appointed for a term of
33	four (4) years.
34	(d) The initial term for council members begins July 1, 2008.
35	(e) This SECTION expires December 31, 2012.
36	SECTION 10. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) If the state
37	department of health grants an exemption to a person that is
38	required to be licensed, or that meets the definition of a person
39	licensed under:
40	(1) IC 16-21-2-2(4); or
41	(2) IC 16-25.5, as added by this act;
42	from a physical plant standard requirement under the person's
43	licensure, the state department may not grant the exemption for a
44	period ending later than December 31, 2011, and the person must
45	meet the physical plant standards required for the person's
46	licensure not later than January 1, 2012.
47	(b) This SECTION expires December 31, 2012.".
