

Winston-Salem State University is committed to equality of educational opportunity and does not discriminate against applicants, students or employees based on race, color, national origin, religion, gender, age or disability. It is the policy of Winston-Salem State University to create diversity among its student body by recruiting and enrolling students without regard to race, gender or ethnicity. Applicants of all races, gender, and ethnic backgrounds are encouraged to apply for enrollment.

FRESHMAN REOUIREMENTS

Winston-Salem State University, defines a "freshman" as any student that has completed the necessary requirements for graduation from the K-12 system or completion of a GED or high school equivalence program who have not enrolled in a two or four year college/university. We invite these students to apply to the university under our Freshman Requirements.

There are several factors that will be used to evaluate applicants for admission to Winston-Salem State University. Factors used to evaluate a student's application are: Quality of High School Academics, Academic Achievement, Standardized Test Scores and Class Rank.

According to the University of North Carolina system, students applying for admission must provide evidence that they have completed or will complete the *Minimum Course Requirements* as listed below:

- . Four (4) units/years of college preparatory English
- Four (4) units/years of Math
 - Algebra I
 - Geometry
 - Algebra II
 - A math course higher than Algebra II (For example: Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Statistics, Models & Functions, Differential Equations and Trigonometry)
- Three (3) units/years of Science
 - 1 unit/year of Biological Science
 - 1 unit/year of Physical Science
 - 1 units/year of an additional Science
- Two (2) units/years of Social Science
 - 1 unit/year of American or U.S. History
 - 1 unit/year of a course of your choosing in the Social Science field
- Two (2) units/years of the same Foreign Language

TRANSFER REOUIREMENTS

Winston-Salem State University defines a "Transfer" as any student that has completed the requirements of the K-12 system and has continued their education at a two or four year college/university prior to the submission of an application to WSSU.

- All transfers over the age of 24 are required to submit all official transcripts from each college/university attended.
- All transfers under the age of 24 who have not obtained an Associates degree, are required to submit an official high school transcript, SAT/ACT scores, and official transcripts from each college/university attended. Applicants under the age of 24, who are missing one of the required high school units (MCR) - listed above, or have earned a GED, or have not taken the SAT/ACT must show the following coursework on their official college transcript: 30 Semester Hours
 - 6 semester hours of college-level English
 - 6 semester hours of college-level Math
 - 6 semester hours of college-level Science
 - 6 semester hours of college-level Social Science
 - 6 semester hours of college-level Foreign Language

Transfer students should remember that:

- Letter grades of "C" or higher must be obtained in college level coursework to be considered for transfer credit
- Students must be in good academic and disciplinary standing at all previous institution(s) and eligible to return to the last institution attended.
- Must have a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.0 or higher on last institution attended

SECOND BACCALAUREATE DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS

Winston-Salem State University defines a "Second Degree" as any student that has previously completed the requirements and earned a Baccalaureate Degree.

- An earned degree must be reflected on official transcript
- Must have a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.0 or higher
- Must submit transcripts from <u>each</u> college/university attended

READMISSION: (FORMER WSSU STUDENTS ONLY)

Students who have previously attended WSSU are eligible for readmission to the institution. Previous academic history will be reviewed upon receipt of application.

- Students who have not attended another college/university since leaving WSSU, are not required to pay an application fee.
- Students who have attended another college/university since leaving WSSU, must submit a \$50 application fee, along with official transcripts from the other institution(s).

NON-DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS/TEACHER CERTIFICATION AND COMPUTER SCIENCE CERTIFICATION STUDENTS

Each semester, individuals have an opportunity to be admitted as Non-degree seeking students, and acquire up to 12 credit hours. *Please note the following:

- Winston-Salem State University assumes no responsibility for determining a student's course selection when the credits are to be transferred to another institution.
- Students are also not eligible for financial aid under this status.
- Credits obtained in this manner will not count towards a degree until a student has met the admission requirements through the Freshman or Transfer process.

SUMMER SCHOOL APPLICANTS

- Admission to Summer School (Session I & II) is open to visiting students who wish to enroll at WSSU and who intend to transfer courses back to their "home" institution.
- Students who are interested in taking classes to transfer to other colleges/universities should obtain approval from their home institution of transfer credit prior to submission of an application
- High School seniors and juniors are eligible for summer enrollment. Possible candidates must display exceptional academic
 achievement that meet or exceed the standards of freshman admission. Students must provide a formal endorsement from their
 Principal on school letterhead.
- First time freshmen are not eligible for summer school.

UPDATE ADMISSION:

Students who have applied to WSSU in the last calendar year (365 days) should mark "update application" under student status. Students who are updating their application should provide new information that has changed from their original application. If attended another college/university, please provide updated transcripts.
