A Message from the Administrator

With all of the discussion in the past few months regarding the future of the MVH – Cape Girardeau and the Missouri Veterans Commission Homes Program, I wanted to take a few minutes to pass along some information.

Executive Director Larry Kay visited with several local community leaders regarding the future of our Home on August 30th and then spoke at a Town Hall Meeting for our Veterans, their families and our staff on September 19th. Both of these meetings were quite informative and well received. While Mr. Kay gave

great detail that, on its current path, the Homes Fund is scheduled to exhaust in 2013, he also shared that several efforts have been taken, and continue to be taken to ensure the ongoing operation of our Home and the Homes Program. I am quite please to say that there has been an overwhelming amount of support shown by our community and we have received numerous pledges of support from our elected officials to solve the Home Program funding challenge.

Recently the FY 2012 Missouri Veterans Commission Game Plan was released. This document shares the vision of the MVC, defines the three programs overseen by the MVC, gives detail of FY 2011 successes and speaks of the Strategic Direction for FY 2012:

1) Promote a Veteran centered culture within the Missouri Veterans Commission;

- 2) Develop and implements mechanisms with our service partners
- to communicate, coordinate, cooperate and collaborate (C4);
- 3) Expand our Veteran Outreach Horizon.

The MVC continues to address three key messages. First, all Veterans are encouraged to see a Veterans Service Officer. Secondly, all Veterans are encouraged to sign up for VA Healthcare. And last, but not least, all Veterans are encouraged to join a Veterans Service Organization.

As we enter the holiday season, we hope to make this a joyous season for our Veterans and their families. We recently had a wonderful Thanksgiving meal with over 600 attending. I want to say that our dietary department and all of our staff did an outstanding job. Now the Christmas decorations are going up everywhere, and plans are in the works for several celebrations and parties. If you have an opportunity, please stop by for a visit.

Since the Missouri Veterans Home in Cape Girardeau opened its doors in 1990, it has been a point of pride for everyone in Southeast Missouri. This 150-bed facility provides superior long-term skilled nursing care for our aging and disabled American heroes in a home-like atmosphere. It also provides significant economic impact to the area with a payroll of over \$5 million.

To date the home has had the privilege of caring for 1,345 Veterans. While some Veterans may only be here a few days or weeks, many have been able to call this home for many years. The average length of stay is a little over 2 years per Veteran. Although a few are discharged to return to a private residence, for most this is their final home.

The Cape Girardeau Veterans Home Foundation Board was established to support the efforts of the staff and to help provide all the extras that turn the "facility" into a true home. As a not-for-profit corporation, we raise and manage funds which are used to help meet the spiritual, emotional, social, physical, intellectual and environmental needs of each Veteran resident.

Since all of us on the board are Veterans or spouses of Veterans and all are members of multiple Veteran Service Organizations, we are in a unique position to rally support from a wide variety of Veteran and non-Veteran groups. This support usually takes the form of sponsorship of events such as golf tournaments and bike rallies. Now, we feel compelled to step forward to rally support for an even greater cause – that of seeing that this home is fully funded now and far into the future, and eliminate even the slightest possibility that the doors may someday close.

We commend the Missouri Veterans Commission for taking a proactive approach. Rather than waiting until there is no money to meet payroll or pay the utility bill at the end of the month, they are looking ahead. We understand that on the current path there is NOT sufficient funding and that something MUST be done.

By signing this letter, each of us individually and collectively urge our legislators to go on record as voting to restore general revenue cuts and/or securing a new dedicated funding source for the Homes Program and the Missouri Veterans Commission. We further urge all concerned citizens to express their personal opinions to their respective senators and representatives about this very important issue, and encourage appropriate action to be taken to avert this disaster.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for admission, a Veteran must meet ALL of the following criteria:

- Active military duty with discharge status other than dishonorable.
- Resident of the State of Missouri for 180 days sometime in their lifetime.
- Must have documentation from a physician that he/she needs skilled nursing home care.
- Health condition must be such that the home has resources to provide adequate care.

Applications are available at any Missouri Veterans Home or Veterans Service Office. Bob Bunn recognized as Veteran of the Month by Cape West Rotary Club



Bob Bunn was named the November Veteran of the Month by Cape West Rotary club. The following is a summary of Bob's many accomplishments, for which he was recognized:

Bob graduated from Missouri State University where he received a BS in Business Administration and completed ROTC training. He joined the Missouri National Guard, and graduated near the top of his class from Army Ordnance Supply School. In 1961 he was recalled to active duty and was assigned to an Army Heavy Ordnance Supply Co at Fort Leonard Wood. While serving in the office of the Comptroller, he conducted a Computer Systems Feasibility Study for which he received a letter of commendation.

In civilian life, Bob's Top Secret Security Clearance gave him the opportunity to manage the installation of a multi-million dollar U.S. Air Force Honeywell computer system for the World-Wide Military Command and Control System. Bob is proud to have been a part of this colossal, history-making undertaking that helped our nation win the cold war.

In 1973 Bob received an MBA in Business Administration with emphasis on Computer Systems. He is a Past Commander of Louis K. Juden American Legion Post 63 in Cape Girardeau. He has lived at the Veterans Home since 2006, where he has used his computer skills to teach classes for Veterans and employees.



Dear Family of the Missouri Veterans Home,
