After a Friday morning plenary session, break-out topics will range from different monitoring techniques to developing quality assurance plans and interpreting data.

Our keynote speaker, Linda Greene, Volunteer Monitoring Representative of the National Water Quality Monitoring Council, will discuss "National Water Quality Monitoring Trends." The Watershed Watch Network Council will provide an overview of progress on the tiered approach and discuss future efforts.

New Jersey State Turnpike: Take Exit #10 (Edison) to Interstate 287 North. Take exit #2B to Route 27 South (New Brunswick). The Clarion Hotel is located 1 mile on Right.
