Training Information

- **DISCOUNTED RATE FOR PCIT-A!!!** PCIT-A will go back to \$800 for the 5-day training.
- Three PCIT Conference Calls can be purchased for \$50, which covers the cost of the conference call telephone lines, and you can choose when to use them. Conference calls are scheduled monthly and fill on a first come first serve basis.
- From August 2003 to June 2008 we have trained 297 clinicians from 76 agencies in 18 states, Canada and Japan in PCIT.
- From October 2004 to June 2008 we have trained 468 people from 28 agencies in 6 states in CARE.
- From February 2006 to June 2008 we have trained 116 clinicians from 51 agencies in 9 states, Canada and Japan in TF-CBT.

PCIT Data Collection Outcomes

As of June 1, 2008 53 clinicians have turned in PCIT data to our site. We have a total of 141 clients entered into the database from these 53 clinicians. Of these, 47 contain outcome data! Special Points of Interest

- 3 complete data outcome packets
- Entire 2nd training is free
- Assist in co-training a session
- Train people within your agency

We have recently developed a Trainer-in-Training Track for those who qualify to become PCIT trainers. First, the trainer-in-training must attend the entire 5 day PCIT training as a trainee. The Trainer-in-Training must collect outcome data on at least 3 cases and be able to show that he/she has been completing the data and conducting PCIT properly. Once the Trainer-in-Training is collecting data on these cases, he/she can co-train a full five-day session of PCIT (free of charge) with the TTTC. After the Trainer-in-Training completes this process, he/she will be given training materials in order to train and sustain PCIT within his/her agency. TTTC staff will continue to mentor and provide consultation to trainers once they have taken these training skills back to their agencies.

Currently, we have trained 31 trainers-in-training in PCIT!

Want to be a CARE trainer?

If you have completed our PCIT training (or an equivalent PCIT training elsewhere), you are able to train CARE. You may purchase a CARE Curriculum Guide for Trainers for \$10, and we will ship this to you. We can also provide you with a CD-Rom of role-plays with a 4-year-old child demonstrating the Avoid skills and Do skills. The Trauma Treatment Training Center is part of OhioCanDo4Kids (CANDO). The mission of CANDO is: To facilitate productive collaborative relationships among institutions, agencies, and individuals that provide services to maltreated and traumatized Ohio children and their families. The goals of CANDO are:

- 1) To facilitate the identification, evaluation, and promotion of best practices in diagnosis, treatment and prevention of childhood trauma;
- 2) To facilitate interdisciplinary communication and to reduce barriers for traumatized children receiving services across multiple Ohio systems;
- 3) To develop and make freely available strategies and tools to transform prevention, treatment, and public education with respect to childhood trauma.

Childhood Trust Events Survey (C-TES)

The CTES is a newly updated, 26-item, self- or parent-report screening survey to assess a child's exposure to traumatic events. Some items were derived from the Traumatic Events Screening Inventory for Children (TESI-C1) and the UCLA PTSD Index.2 The CTES also includes all the items identified as Adverse Childhood Events (ACEs) in extensive research by Fellitti and colleagues in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.³ The ACE items address I) whether the child has experienced personal abuse (recurrent physical abuse, recurrent emotional abuse, and sexual abuse) and 2) whether the child has lived in a household with any of the following: an alcoholic or drug user; a person who was in prison; someone who was chronically depressed, mentally ill, or suicidal; or a mother who was treated violently; or whether a child has experienced complete and lengthy separation from a parent, such as a permanent foster placement or the death of a parent.
