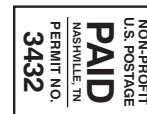

The number of Nurse Practitioners (NPs) caring for transplant patients has increased significantly in the past few years. NPs' focus on acute/ chronic illness and emphasis on preventative maintenance match well with the unique needs of transplant patients.
