

Statement of Need

Treating patients with ST segment elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI) presents significant challenges to cardiologists, emergency physicians and pre-hospital personnel. Because delays in treating a myocardial infarction increase the likelihood and amount of cardiac muscle damage due to localized hypoxia, ACC/AHA guidelines recommend a door-to-balloon interval of no more than 90 minutes. According to a study reported in Circulation, currently fewer than half of STEMI patients receive reperfusion with primary percutaneous coronary intervention within the timeframe recommended by the guideline.

Target Audience

This conference is designed for emergency physicians, cardiologists, nurses, emergency management service personnel (EMS), residents/fellows, and other health care professionals involved in the treatment of patients with cardiovascular disease.

Objectives
