

HOW TO APPLY

Return this completed application along with the following required items:

- \$35 nonrefundable application fee.
- Official high school transcripts. (Original transcripts in languages other than English must be accompanied by English translations.)
- Official university transcripts, if applicable. (Original transcripts in languages other than English must be accompanied by English translations.)
- Copy of your TOEFL score card.
- Copy of your passport
- Financial Declaration. (Official document showing us that you have the necessary funds to attend Saint Martin's. Amount should cover the cost of tuition, room and board.
- Completed Housing Contract. (If you will not live on campus, you must complete the Housing Waiver Form.)
- Completed Roommate Preferences Form.
- Completed Medical History Form.
- Completed Immunization Record Form. (Must have documentation of a tuberculosis (TB) test within the last year.)
- Completed Insurance Waiver Form. (Insurance is also available to purchase.)
- Copy of your insurance information
- Copy of your insurance card
- \$40 international express courier fee for I-20 visa documents (This fee is optional, but will ensure faster delivery of your visa documents.)

Saint Martin's English as a Second Language (ESL) courses are designed primarily for international and immigrant students to improve English language skills for the purpose of matriculating into Saint Martin's University. A secondary purpose is to provide exchange students with an educational experience, while enhancing the university community by bringing an international presence to campus through students that come to study ESL. The ESL curriculum is divided into two course subtypes: skills-based classes and content-based classes. ESL classes are sectioned according to four levels of communicative competence.

No required TOEFL score is necessary for entry into the program. Level placement according to TOEFL score, if it is available, is generally as follows for the institutional paper-based exam:

Level 1 = 375 - 415 Level 2 = 415 - 445 Level 3 = 445 - 475 Level 4 = 475 - 524

Students with a TOEFL score of 480 – 524 may take a combination of ESL and regular undergraduate courses. Students with TOEFL scores of 525 on the institutional paper-based TOEFL and above are eligible for full-time undergraduate study at Saint Martin's. The number of levels and courses offered each semester are necessarily based on enrollment numbers.
