Before Registration

- Conduct preliminary research on potential topics. A research question, preliminary outline and bibliography must be approved by your faculty supervisor prior to registration.
- Network with faculty to determine their availability and relevance to the research topic. Some faculty members prefer to be consulted one semester prior to the semester you plan to register. You are responsible for finding a faculty supervisor.
- **ID, IER, IP**, **IPCR, and UFSP** students are required to follow field-specific SRP guidelines that are available from your academic advisor or division office.
- If you are planning to do research abroad, you will need to complete the Graduate Global Practicum (GGP). The GGP form is available in the Graduate Academic Advising Office or from our website (http://www.american.edu/sis/advising-grad/graduateglobalpracticum.pdf). Please consult your academic advisor for more information.

Registration Procedures

- 1. Complete ALL REQUIRED SPACES on the Independent Study Registration form.
- 2. Sign the form, have your faculty supervisor sign, and bring the form and required attachments (including the completed GGP if applicable) to your academic advisor. Your academic advisor will obtain the Department Chair/Dean signature and submit the form to the Registrar's Office.
- 3. Return the form to your academic advisor as soon as possible. Please note the deadlines listed on the Academic Calendar (http://www.american.edu/provost/registrar/schedule/academic-calendar.cfm). If the internship is the only course for which you plan to register in a semester, the deadline to register without a late fee is the Friday before the first day of classes.

Important Information

- An SRP is graded on an A/F scale. A student must receive a B or better to earn credit. A Thesis MUST be taken P/F. Independent study or reading projects may be taken P/F or A/F.
- Independent study courses may be registered across multiple semesters by dividing the credits. For example, a 3 credit SRP may be registered as 2 credits of SRP in the fall semester and 1 credit of SRP in the spring semester.
- Work is expected to be completed during the semester when the course is registered. An *In Progress* (IP) or *Incomplete* (I) grade may be assigned by the faculty supervisor if work is not completed in a timely manner.
- Students who register SIS 794 SRP with Coursework are required to complete all course requirements in addition to writing an SRP. Professors may allow the SRP to serve as the final course paper. The professor of the course must serve as the SRP faculty supervisor and the SRP and course must be thematically related. Please consult with your academic advisor for more information.

REQUIRED ATTACHMENTS

- Independent Study and Independent Reading Courses: Attach a brief outline of your proposed study including a statement about the rationale and objectives of the study and your work plan.
- **Master's Thesis:** Attach your thesis proposal with the appropriate cover page signed by both members of your faculty thesis committee.
- Substantial Research Paper: Attach a brief statement of your research question(s) and a preliminary outline and bibliography.


