- **Non-Empirical Research** (In this type of research, no data are collected. APSU Plan I or Plan II is appropriate as defined in the student's discipline.)

- Students will be assigned a table for tri-fold posters, equipment, material, and the like.
- Laptops are appropriate, but students must bring their own extension cords.
- Students should be stationed at their table as much as possible during the day to explain their research/creative activity to guests
