

### Follow these steps to apply for School of Psychology Merit Scholarships:

- 1. READ the description and criteria for each scholarship.
- 2. **DECIDE** which scholarships you are applying for.
- **3. PREPARE** by writing essays, vita and asking for recommendations as required.
- 4. SUBMIT ONLINE all application materials to Student Financial Services by 5 PM Friday, March 2, 2012.

## **Very Important Details**

**Apply for Financial Aid**—You need to have a completed 2012-2013 Fuller Financial Aid Application on file. Apply online by going to <a href="http://www.fuller.edu/Admissions/Financial-Aids/2012-2013-Financial-Aids-Eorms.aspx">http://www.fuller.edu/Admissions/Financial-Aids/2012-2013-Financial-Aids-Eorms.aspx</a>

U.S. citizens and permanent residents must submit a FAFSA. Please use your 2011 completed tax forms.

**Vita**—A vita is required for all applications.

- Include your name and Student ID (G#) on each page of the vita.
- Save your vita as a Microsoft Word document or PDF file.
  - Important! Do not combine your vita with your essays.
- Use your own name and the word "vita" as the file name for the file containing the vita like this: "yourname\_vita.doc" or "yourname\_vita.pdf".
  - For example: if your name was Phil McGraw, the name of your file would be "philmcgraw vita.doc".

**Essay Responses**—Write a separate essay for each award that requires an essay. Using the same essay for each award is not acceptable. Be sure your essay addresses the specific criteria for that award.

- Include your name and Student ID (G#) on each essay page.
- On each essay page write the corresponding scholarship name.
- Combine all of your essays into one Microsoft Word document or PDF file.

- Use your own name and the word "essay" as the file name for the file containing all of your essays like this: "yourname essay.doc" or "yourname essay.pdf".
  - For example: if your name was Clarissa Freud, the name of your file would be "clarissafreud essay.doc".

#### **Letters of Recommendation or Support**— If you are applying for:

- Give a completed Scholarship Recommendation Form (see page 3 of this packet) and the descriptions of
  each scholarship that you are applying for to each person you are asking for a recommendation or letter of
  support. Be sure to include your name, student ID, sign the waiver, and list the awards you are applying for
  on each form.
- Scholarships that require a faculty recommendation: Ask for **ONE** recommendation from a faculty member. You do not need a separate recommendation for each scholarship.
- Scholarships that require letters of support: Ask for **ONE** letter of support from a pastor or other professional as stated in the award criteria. You do not need a separate recommendation for each scholarship.
- All letters should be sent in sealed envelopes directly to the Student Financial Services Office.
- It is your responsibility to verify with your recommender that recommendations have been submitted by the deadline. Due to volume, the Student Financial Services is unable confirm the receipt of any recommendation or letter of support.

## **Very Important Details Continued**

**Submitting Your Application**—You will submit your application and any required essays and vita ONLINE to the Student Financial Services Office.

- Go to http://www.fuller.edu/Admissions/Financial-Aids/2012-2013-Financial-Aid-Forms.aspx
- Click on the 2012-2013 School of Psychology Scholarship link.
- Complete the online form and select the scholarships you are applying for.
- Upload your properly named essay file (see Essays on the first page) as necessary.
- Upload your properly name vita file (see Vita on the first page) as necessary.
- Click the Submit button. A confirmation page will appear and the same will also be sent to the email address you specified on the form.

**Timeline**—All materials, including recommendations must be received by Student Financial Services by **5 pm Friday, March 2, 2012. Late submissions will not be considered.** 

- Award recipients will be notified by April 30, 2012.
- Recipients will be asked to attend the Student Awards Convocation in May 2012.
- Recipients will be required to submit a brief biography and thank-you note for the donor before funds can be released. Letters of thanks will be due to the SOP dean's office on June 3, 2012.

#### Notes:

- Most recipients are selected by the recommendation of a faculty scholarship committee and a vote of the combined faculty in consultation with the donor of the award.
- Students currently completing their final year of the program are welcome to apply. Any scholarship awarded will then be applied to the student's outstanding balance upon graduation.

Q: My recommender gave me their recommendation to submit to Student Financial Services. Is that okay? A: Yes, but it must come in a sealed envelope, preferably with a signature across the flap.

Q: Can recommendations be faxed?

A: No, unless the recommender is out of the country and, due to unreliable service, is unable to submit the recommendation by mail. In that case, please contact Student Financial Services for the available options.

# Section One - School of Psychology Awards

Final Award amounts may vary and are subject to available funding.

### ☐ Alumni/ae Merit Scholarship (Clinical and MFT)

This scholarship recognizes both clinical and marriage and family students who exhibit unusual potential for contributing to the field of Christian mental health following graduation.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$1,000

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less describing your unique clinical skills and/or service delivery models, as well as examples of practical integration, and how you plan to contribute to the field of Christian mental health.
- A letter of recommendation from faculty, clinical supervisor, pastor, or other professional that documents your potential for professional contribution.
- A copy of your vita.

## ☐ Amadeus Award (Clinical or MFT)

The Amadeus Award was established to support students in the School of Psychology who actively present Christ as the foundation for the client's healing. Recipients of the Amadeus scholarship fund may be pursuing any degree program in the School of Psychology; have completed one or more years of study in the School of Psychology; and maintained a 3.0 grade point average.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$2,669

Applications should include:

- Using Psalm 62:5-8 as your reference point, please write a 3-4 page (maximum, double-spaced) personal reflective essay describing how you see your own and your client's ultimate identity, worth, and healing as dependent upon and coming from God (i.e. Jesus Christ). Use specific examples of how this applies to your life and your work with specific clients. In your writing, strive to integrate theology and psychology in a personal and specific way. Applicants should also attach a sheet describing financial need. The donor of this scholarship will review the essays.
- A copy of your vita.

#### ☐ Barbara Williams Skinner & Tom Skinner Award for Service to the Inner City (Clinical or MFT)

This scholarship recognizes an African-American student in the School of Psychology who is committed to working with couples, families and communities in the inner city.

Amount for 2012-2013: varies

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less recapping your experience working with inner city communities and outlining your commitment to that community in terms of work after graduation.
- A letter of recommendation from someone who is familiar with your work with persons residing in the inner city.
- A copy of your vita.

#### ☐ Dilworth International Graduate Fellowship (Clinical or MFT)

Through a generous bequest of the Dilworth family, this fellowship has been made available to recognize international students who plan to minister or teach in their home country upon completion of degree requirements. *Amount for 2012-2013:* \$4,463

Application should include:

- Country of citizenship and birth.
- A statement of 500 words or less describing your plans for ministry in your home country.
- A letter of support from a pastor or other leader in your home country, or from the appropriate missions' board.
- A copy of your vita.

### ■ Dunavant/Reeves Scholarship (Clinical or MFT)

This scholarship recognizes a School of Psychology student with strong interest in an area of family studies who is enrolled in either the Department of Clinical Psychology or Department of Marriage and Family of the School of Psychology.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$3,299
Application should include:

• A written statement of academic interest in the area of family studies.

- A list of courses taken in family studies or family psychology.
- A list of papers presented/published in the area of family psychology or family studies.
- Examples of experience with delivery of services to families.
- For doctoral students: Thesis or dissertation research in family psychology and/or a major clinical placement in family service delivery. Limit to 500 words.
- A copy of your vita.

# ■ Martin Luther King, Jr Scholarship (Clinical or MFT)

This scholarship recognizes a student of African descent in the School of Psychology who demonstrates in their life and ministry, social justice and leadership as incarnated by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$506

Application should include:

- A statement of 500 words or less describing your past and present involvement in ministry, social justice and leadership and your future plans.
- A letter of support from a pastor or other leader describing your involvement in ministry, social justice and leadership.
- · A copy of your vita.

# ☐ Stafford/Enright Scholarship (Clinical or MFT)

This scholarship recognizes an international student in the Masters or Clinical Psychology Program in the School of Psychology.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$589

- An essay of 500 words or less describing the characteristics, accomplishment, and plans for utilizing your training in your home country that qualify you to receive this award.
- A copy of your vita.

## ☐ International Student Scholarship (Clinical or MFT)

This scholarship recognizes an international student in the School of Psychology with financial need who is planning to return to his or her home country to serve his or her people.

Amount for 2010-2011: \$590

Application should include:

- Country of citizenship and birth.
- A statement of 500 words or less describing your plans for ministry in your home country.
- A letter of support from a pastor or other leader in your home country, or from the appropriate missions' board.
- A copy of your vita.

# SECTION TWO - MARRIAGE & FAMILY AWARDS

#### ☐ Dennis B. Guernsey Memorial Award (MFT)

Given in honor of the late Dennis B. Guernsey, former associate dean for marriage and family programs, this award recognizes a student in the Department of Marriage and Family who is striving to live a balanced life, including maintenance of family and other interpersonal relationships, academic excellence, application of theory to practice, spiritual health, ministry/church involvement, and self care.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$2,903

Application should include:

- Your cumulative GPA.
- Short statement regarding family life and interpersonal relationships.
- Example of clinical application of theory to practice.
- Summary of involvement in church and ministry, listing of forms of self-care (limit to 500 words).
- A letter of support from a pastor or spiritual director.
- A copy of your vita.

#### ■ Jeffrey Balswick Memorial Award (MFT)

This award is given annually in memory of Jeff Balswick, the late son of Drs. Jack and Judy Balswick, of the Department of Marriage and Family. This award recognizes master's students in the Department of Marriage and Family who have demonstrated academic and/or clinical excellence, financial need, and a commitment to the application of family therapy or family studies in cross-cultural contexts.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$2,896

Application should include:

- Documentation of cross-cultural experience (i.e. term paper, research project, publication or presentation, participation in cross-cultural events or committees, etc.). Limit to 500 words.
- A copy of your vita.

## □ Ray Anderson Integration Scholarship (MFT)

This scholarship recognizes a marriage and family student who demonstrates a strong commitment to the integration of Christian faith and clinical practice.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$500

Application should include:

- A two-page reflection paper of 500 words or less on integration.
- A copy of your vita.

### SECTION THREE - CLINICAL AWARDS

### ■ Angehr-Westbrook-McMillen Memorial Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship is given to a student with financial need who has demonstrated outstanding academic achievement and Christian leadership and lifestyle.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$1,611

Application should include:

- A reflective essay of 500 words or less outlining your financial need, academic achievements and how you strive to be a Christian leader both in word and in action.
- A copy of your vita.

### ☐ Arch Hart Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship will be given to students who either come from Africa, desire to work in Africa, or are African-Americans who show a special giftedness in following Dr. Hart's example of building a bridge between the Church and Psychology, and a desire to apply their training as psychologists to the enhancement of the Church and its ministry throughout the world.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$4,194 Application should include:

- An essay on the following questions:
  - o What is your background that prepares you for ministry to underserved peoples?
  - o How do you see psychology as a ministry?
  - o What are you plans after graduation and how do they include serving underserved populations?
  - A copy of your vita.

#### ☐ Carlsberg Family Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship is given to a returning clinical psychology student who demonstrates financial need and evidences a particular interest in health psychology and/or the function of the brain.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$7,157

Application should include:

- A proposal of 500 words or less about research you have done or will do in one of the areas above.
- A letter of support from a faculty advisor or other professional with whom you have engaged in this type of research or coursework.
- A vita that includes publications, publications at professional meetings, as well as other relevant material (courses in health psychology and neuropsychology, etc.).

### ☐ Clare W. Headington Memorial Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship is given to clinical psychology students in either the second or third year of the program, who have demonstrated the ability to relate the Christian faith and psychological principles to the emotional problems of individuals and families.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$13,770 Application should include:

• One or two sentences that document your integration competencies (this might include listing appropriate courses taken and grades earned).

- A case study of up to 250 words on how you have applied psychological principles and Christian faith to individual or family problems.
- A recommendation letter from a professor or clinical supervisor.
- A copy of your vita.

### ☐ Edith Munger Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship will be given to a female student pursuing her Ph.D. in clinical psychology as preparation for a second career. The student must be matriculating in their second through sixth year of the Clinical Psychology program at Fuller Theological Seminary, School of Psychology. The award will be for one year. Recipients are invited to re-apply for the award in subsequent years, though preference will not necessarily be given to their applications.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$3.617

Application should include:

- An essay describing why you have chosen to pursue a second career in clinical psychology.
- A copy of your vita.

### **☐** Evelyn and Frank Freed Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship is presented to a clinical psychology student who is genuinely committed to glorifying God by integrating personal faith and professional practice. This student will also demonstrate concern for working with a particular population of clients. The faculty in consultation with the donors selects the recipient of this award.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$3,306

Application should include:

- An essay of 500-750 words indicating ways they have integrated Christian faith and professional practice.
- A copy of your vita.

### ☐ Grace Li Jubilee Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship recognizes an international doctoral student in the Department of Clinical Psychology from a developing country who is preparing for mental health service and ministry in developing countries.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$1.146

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less describing what your career and ministry goals are and in which developing country.
- A copy of your vita.

#### ☐ H. Newton and Suzanna Malony Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship recognizes the academic success of an ethnic minority student in the Department of Clinical Psychology, with preference for African-American students.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$2,000

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less describing the characteristics and accomplishments that you believe qualify you to receive this award.
- A copy of your vita.

#### ☐ Hansen Family Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship recognizes a students in good standing in the Department of Clinical psychology who is African-American, Hispanic, Native American or from a two-thirds world country and is preparing for leadership in a ministry that is either US or Internationally-based. Student's academic focus must be on equipping leaders in the church and they must meet the criteria for financial need.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$2,893

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less describing personal characteristics, accomplishments and future plans that you
  believe qualify you to receive this award.
- A copy of your vita.

## ☐ Heavenly Treasure Jubilee Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship recognizes an international doctoral student in the Department of Clinical Psychology from a developing country who is preparing for mental health service and ministry in developing countries, with a preference for Asia. *Amount for* 2012-2013: \$1,540

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less describing what your career and ministry goals in Asia or another developing region/country.
- A copy of your vita.

### ☐ John P. Davis Jr. Memorial Award (Clinical)

The John P. Davis award remembers a person who brought all dimensions of his life to his therapy. He loved his family and friends; he was a sportsman who loved to sail, ride motorcycles and play tennis; an Episcopalian Priest who continued to practice ministry; a therapist who brought openness, intelligence and a sense of the sacred to his practice. He exemplified the integration that the school cherishes. The award is given to a clinical psychology student who is deeply involved in personal growth and in the deepening of his/her spiritual life, and who recognizes that **it is one's person that is primary in being a therapist**. The faculty in consultation with the donor selects the recipient of this award.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$2,269

Application should include:

- An essay or clear statement of 500 words or less describing the personal growth experiences that you have engaged in and how they have deepened your spirituality and personal maturity.
- A copy of your vita.

### ☐ John Stauffer Memorial Merit Fellowship (Clinical)

This fellowship recognizes a clinical psychology student with demonstrated excellence in the following eight areas:

- ♦ High potential for professional and scientific creativity.
- ♦ Demonstrated leadership skills.
- Presentation of research papers at professional conferences.
- Publication of articles in psychological journals.
- ♦ Manifestation of a clear commitment to public service.
- Articulation of clear professional goals.
- ♦ Maintenance of an outstanding academic record.
- Leadership through grant proposals or designing new models for delivering human services.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$5,000

Application should include:

- One essay of 500 words or less describing examples of leadership activities in profession and community in each
  of the eight areas listed above.
- A letter of recommendation from a faculty member or other professional who is familiar with your work.
- A copy of your vita.

#### ☐ Lee Merritt Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship is given to a returning clinical psychology student who demonstrates financial need.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$3,982

- No essay is required.
- A copy of your vita.

#### ☐ Richard Gorsuch (Clinical)

This scholarship honors Richard Gorsuch and is given to a doctoral student who, through their research and professional practice seeks to resolve conflict within congregations and across social groups, and/or apply their training in other areas that Dr. Gorsuch has championed.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$1.034

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less describing how your research and practice seeks to resolve conflict within congregations and across social groups or in other areas that Dr. Gorsuch has championed.
- A copy of your vita.

### ☐ Tan Family Jubilee Scholarship (Clinical)

This scholarship recognizes an international doctoral student in the Clinical Psychology Department from a developing country who is preparing for mental health service and ministry in a developing country.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$1,044

Application should include:

- An essay of 500 words or less describing what your career and ministry goals are and in which developing country.
- A copy of your vita.

## SECTION FOUR - AWARDS BY NOMINATION ONLY

#### **CLINICAL**

#### Gene Wesley Pfrimmer Memorial Award (PGU Nomination)

Established as a memorial by Gene Pfrimmer's family and friends, this award is given annually to a student in the Clinical Psychology Department who actively promotes a sense of cooperation and unity among the members of the graduate union with fairness and justice.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$1,192

#### **MFT**

#### Marriage and Family Department Community Award (PGU Nomination)

This award recognizes a marriage and family master's student who has, in the judgment of his or her peers, embodied the ideals of servant leadership in fostering Christian community in the student body.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$500

#### Marriage and Family Faculty Award (MFT Faculty Nomination only)

This award honors a current doctoral student or a graduating master's student in the Department of Marriage and Family, who has been accepted to doctoral study, and who, in the faculty's judgment, demonstrates the highest levels of clinical and scholarly potential as a professional in the field of family therapy or family studies.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$500

#### SCHOOL OF PSYCHOLOGY

#### School of Psychology Dean's Awards (SOP Faculty Nomination only)

These awards recognize one first year student each from the Department of Clinical Psychology and Department of Marriage and Family, who demonstrate academic competence, a strong Christian faith, and a commitment to the integration of psychology and theology.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$500 each

#### **ALL-SEMINARY**

### David Allan Hubbard Achievement Award (SOP Faculty Nomination only)

This award comes from an initial endowment fund created by Homer and Margaret Surbeck, who, as laypersons, are active in Christian organizations. Their gift was intended to signify their appreciation for the work of the seminary and in particular for the outstanding leadership provided by the former president, the late David Allen Hubbard. The award recognizes a graduating student whose accomplishments clearly reflect the academic, spiritual, and professional goals of his or her school, and who shows promise in his or her chosen ministry.

Amount for 2012-2013: \$500

#### ❖ Fuller Women's Legacy Award (Faculty Nomination only)

This award is given in the memory of great Fuller women—such as Virginia Archer, Margaret Barker, Jerel Bush, Grace Fuller, Mary Gay, Arline Harrison, Christine Jewett, Winifred Ladd, Mary Elizabeth McGavran, Mary Jane Smith, Julia Banks, and Frances Southard—who made a lasting impact on all those who were privileged to know them. The award recognizes a woman who exemplifies the Christian commitment and qualities of the women in whose honor the award is given. The recipient of this award shows considerable promise of making a significant contribution to the ministries of Jesus Christ.

Amount in 2011: \$1,700
