The *Richard J. Brett Memorial Scholarship* was established in 1995 to honor the life and work of Mr. Brett, the speech correctionist at Waukeegan High School in Illinois for 49 years. Throughout his life, Mr. Brett enjoyed travel and believed strongly that travel experiences are an important component in the educational process. It is the purpose of this scholarship to assist worthy and deserving students by supporting study abroad experiences, thereby enriching their education.

The recipient shall be a student in good standing in the ISU Honors Program whose plans for international educational travel will enhance their academic goals.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Preference will be given to student candidates for this award who:

- 1. Have earned a minimum of 30 semester hours (a minimum of 12 hours of Honors at ISU) with a GPA of 3.5 or higher overall and in Honors course work.
- 2. Meaningfully integrate study abroad with their academic goals will be given preference.
- 3. Have a minimum of one additional semester of study remaining at ISU after completing the study abroad program will be given preference.
- 4. Intend to participate in an accredited study abroad program.
- 5. Are proficient in a foreign language, as demonstrated through college or high school study.

OBLIGATIONS FOR AWARD RECIPIENTS

Award recipients are expected to:

- 1. Submit a written essay describing their international educational experience to the University Honors Program office on completion of the experience.
- 2. Commit to promotion of study abroad for Honors students upon return.
