Catana Brown PhD, OTR, FAOTA received a B.S. in occupational therapy from Colorado State University, an M.A. in occupational therapy from New York University and a PhD in Educational Psychology from the University of Kansas. She is currently an Associate Professor in Occupational Therapy Education at the University of Kansas Medical Center. Along with Winnie Dunn PhD, OTR, FAOTA, Dr. Brown developed the Adolescent/Adult Sensory Profile. In addition, Dr. Brown is engaged in federally funded research investigating the relationship of cognition and community outcomes for people with schizophrenia. She has numerous publications and presentations.

The Adolescent/Adult Sensory Profile: Theory, Assessment and Intervention

The Adolescent/Adult Sensory Profile is a theory-based measure of sensory processing in everyday life that can be administered in about 20 minutes. It is designed for individuals with and without disabilities age 11 – 65+. In this course participants will learn how to administer and interpret the measure. This will include the opportunity for participants to evaluate their own sensory processing preferences. Participants will also learn how to assess sensory features of the environment. The course will provide participants with the knowledge and skills necessary to use the results of the evaluation to create an intervention plan.

Objectives

Successful completion of the course will enable participants to:

- Understand the four quadrant model of sensory processing
- Describe the relationship of sensory processing preferences and participation in daily life activities

- Administer the Adolescent/Adult Sensory Profile
- Interpret the results of the Adolescent/Adult Sensory Profile
- Identify the sensory processing preferences common to specific populations
- · Assess the sensory features of the environment
- Design targeted interventions for individuals with differences in each of the four quadrants of the model of sensory processing


