- Thursday, August 23: New Student Convocation at 4:00pm
- Friday, August 24: Academic Day (all-day event)
- Saturday, August 25: Service Learning Project (optional event)

Note: Fall semester classes begin Monday, August 27.

- Click on the link to Activate Your Ship Email Address
- The system will prompt you to set a password for your Ship email account
- Once you have your Ship email account activated, please send an email to ASP at
 asp@ship.edu. We will use this as a form of communication with you for updates and reminders.

Remember: This email is the official means of communication between you and the offices at the University, so you should use a password that you will remember, and be sure to check your email **every day** throughout the summer and **every day** during each semester.

The Early Start Program is a component of the university's Academic Success Program (ASP), which serves approximately 180 new students through various summer programs.
