In 1991, Dr. Giordano's dream came true. Belmont University founded a chapter of Psi Chi National Honor Society on October 15, 1991. This organization has done many great things throughout its existence, including winning Psi Chi's Regional Chapter Award in 2005. November 28, 2001, the chapter was able to celebrate its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary in the Grand Salon of the Belmont Mansion with an invited speaker, who was a prominent figure in establishing the chapter, Dr. Steven Davis. As of today, after 15 years of service, this chapter has inducted a total of 229 members.

February 23, 2007, was the date that Belmont University Psi Chi chapter alums gathered with current members, faculty members, new inductees, and new inductee's family and friends to celebrate the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Belmont University's Psi Chi National Honor Society. The anniversary celebration, held once again in the Belmont Mansion, consisted of dinner, an excellent presentation of the history of the chapter, a formal induction, and a brilliant speech on Synesthesia by Dr. Randolph Blake of Vanderbilt University. This night was a night of celebration of the past 15 years, a celebration of special people who have made the chapter what it is, and a celebration of the new inductees' success.

The evening began with a brief introduction of the alums that came out to support the new members and was shortly followed with a delicious dinner. Kurt Niesner introduced a slideshow on the history of Belmont's Psi Chi Chapter that was created by Eileen Marks and Shandus Valentine. The slideshow celebrated the wide ray of events and accomplishments of the chapter's 15 years of existence.

After the presentation of the history of Belmont's Psi Chi Chapter, two very special awards were given to prominent figures in the development of our chapter. Dr. Michael Loftin was given the National Service Award for his dedication and contributions to this chapter. Dr. Loftin served as president of Psi Chi while he was a student at Belmont University.
