

Depart your gateway city for **Buenos Aires**, **Argentina**.

DAY TWO

BUENOS AIRES

Upon arrival, transfer by motorcoach to the *Amerian Buenos Aires Hotel*. (Flight and transfer provided for Air Program participants only.)

Educational Focus: *A History of Buenos Aires.* Explore the political and cultural heritage of the Argentine capital. Learn about its early indigenous inhabitants, Spanish colonization in the 16th-18th centuries and life since the country declared independence from Spain in 1810.

Take an orientation walk of your hotel's neighborhood with your Campus Director and familiarize yourself with its environs.

This evening, gather at the hotel for a *Welcome Reception and Dinner*.

DAY THREE BUENOS AIRES

Excursion: *Buenos Aires.* Discover the elegance of Buenos Aires in its turn-of-the-century neighborhoods and wide boulevards. Discover the colonial architecture of San Telmo. Admire the grand buildings of the Plaza de Mayo: the Casa Rosada, Cathedral and Parliament House. Continue to the historic Recoleta Cemetery.

Local Flavor: Lunch is served at the Café Tortoni, a legendary coffeehouse in the Buenos Aires arts community.

Cultural Event: *Tango, the Soul of Argentina.* Learn the basics of the sensuous tango, Argentina's most famous dance. The tango was born in the late 19th century in the poorer neighborhoods of

Buenos Aires, but this passionate dance is now performed in ballrooms around the world!

Independent Exploration: The evening is at leisure, but if you want to continue your tango experience,



we can make reservations for you to have dinner and see a performance at one of the city's famous tango houses.

DAY FOUR The Pampas

Educational Focus and Excursion: *The Pampas—Meet the People.* Visit the legendary Draghi silversmith workshop and museum, where artisans create exquisite and ornate spurs, bolos and other ornaments associated with the way of life in the Pampas. Continue to an *estancia*, a traditional ranch in the Pampas where the work and play of *gauchos* is steeped in tradition. See a demonstration of gaucho skills.

Local Flavor: Beef is the mainstay of the Argentine diet. *Asado*, grilling, is the preferred way of preparing it. After a delicious *asado* lunch, enjoy a traditional folk singing and dancing performance.

Independent Exploration: Enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure in Buenos Aires.

DAY FIVE BUENOS AIRES & PUERTO IGUAZÚ

This morning, fly to **Puerto Iguazú**, **Argentina**, and transfer to the *Amerian Portal del Iguazú Hotel*.

Excursion: *Walk the Falls.* Discover Iguazú Falls, which forms part of the border between Brazil and Argentina. The 275 falls, which stretch twice as long as Niagara Falls, are home to a diversity of plants and animals. View the spectacular beauty and feel the power of the falls as you cross the catwalks built directly over the falls.





UNESCO

Iguazú National Park (1984) is a UNESCO *World Heritage List* site featured in this program. These sites are distinguished due to universal scenic, historic, artistic or scientific value.

DAY SIX

PUERTO IGUAZÚ & MENDOZA

Independent Exploration: The morning is at your leisure.

This afternoon, fly to **Mendoza** and transfer to the *Executive Hotel Park Suites*.

Day Seven Mendoza

Excursion: *Los Caminos del Vino.* Travel the wine roads in the province of Mendoza. The snowcapped Andes are the backdrop to the fertile valleys. Explore Mendoza's High Zone, where Malbec is the predominant variety of grape. Visit an esteemed *bodega* for a guided winery tour and a wine tasting.

Local Flavor: Sample local wines as you enjoy lunch in the countryside.



DAY EIGHT MENDOZA Educational Focus: *Contemporary*

Argentina. Discuss the social, political and economic aspects of Argentine life.

Independent Exploration: The rest of the day is at your leisure to explore Mendoza. It is a pleasant city to explore on foot. The trees that line the boulevards provide a cool canopy for strolling or enjoying a refreshing drink at one of the sidewalk cafés.

CHILE

DAY NINE ANDEAN CROSSING

Excursion: *Journey Across the Andes Mountains.* Travel to Santiago, Chile, through the scenic Potrerillos and Uspallata valleys. This region was inhabited by the Huarpes people long before the Spanish claimed the territory, but it was the Spanish who developed this famous route from Chile to Argentina to expand their territory east of the Andes. See the beauty of the Andes unfold. See Aconcagua Mountain, which at 22,834 feet (6,959 meters), is the highest mountain in the Western Hemisphere.

Local Flavor: Lunch is served en route. Upon arrival, check in at the *Radisson Plaza Santiago Hotel*.

Tonight, gather with your fellow travelers for a *Graduation Ceremony* and *Farewell Dinner*.

day ten Santiago

Excursion: *Santiago.* See Moneda Palace and the Plaza de Armas. Enjoy exploring the Pre-Columbian Museum, which has an outstanding collection of ancient artifacts from the region. See the Parque Forestal and the Fine Arts Museum. Take in a panoramic view of the city with the Andes in the background from San Cristobal Hill.

Later this afternoon, transfer to the airport for the return flight to your gateway city. (Provided for Air Program participants only.)

NOTE: Itinerary schedule may change due to local conditions. Many excursions involve an element of walking, as some of the finest attractions are not closely accessible by motorcoach.



Malbec, the star of Mendoza

Mendoza is a favorite of wine enthusiasts around the world. Surrounding the city are some of South America's best and most fertile vineyards. The region's vineyards produce roughly 70 percent of Argentina's wine. Here, winegrowers favor Malbec, Mendoza's signature grape. This temperamental vine, difficult to grow in many places because it is susceptible to disease, rot, mildew and other viticultural nuisances, flourishes in the arid plains near the city. The Andes block eastward-moving clouds, limiting rain to barely 8 inches each year. Instead, water is provided by acequias, irrigation ditches, that carry snowmelt from the mountains. Those factors, along with long hours of sunshine and mild winds, have produced the ideal growing conditions for Malbec, which traditionally has been one of the grapes used to blend Bordeaux. In Mendoza, however, the Malbec grape produces an outstanding varietal wine.

AHI has designated specific Group Air Schedules for this departure utilizing round-trip, scheduled jet service from North America to Buenos Aires, Argentina with return from Santiago, Chile. Those participating on these flights will enjoy motorcoach transfers between the arrival/departure airport abroad and the hotels, including baggage handling. Prices are dependent upon dates, air routes and class of service chosen and will be reflected on your Reservation Confirmation, which will be sent to you upon receipt of your reservation. Air schedules will be sent with your Final Invoice approximately 90 days before departure. Prices quoted to you will include all domestic and foreign governmental airport departure taxes and fees and any applicable fuel surcharges. AHI ticketed passengers will also receive Automatic \$250,000 Flight Insurance, subject to policy terms.

NOT INCLUDED-Fees for passports and, if applicable, visas; personal gratuities; laundry and dry cleaning; excursions, wines, liquors, mineral waters and meals not mentioned in this brochure under included features; travel insurance; all items of a strictly personal nature.
