Note: The normal rate of work is defined as four courses per semester, each bearing four credit hours and each counting toward the 32 courses required as the graduation standard. Some courses, notably physical education courses, do not contribute toward the calculation of a legal course load or progress toward the graduation standard. Students enrolling in them do so as a supplement to an otherwise legal program of study. The **minimum rate of work** is three semester courses (12 credits) per term and seven (28 credits) per academic year. The **maximum rate of work** is 5.5 semester courses (22 credits) per term and 11 (44 credits) per academic year.
