### **CAMP INFORMATION**

### A NOTE FROM THE COACH

Coach Lancaster has once again assembled a quality staff for the 2011 camp. The instructors selected to work at this camp have a wealth of baseball knowledge, good work ethic, and a genuine love for the game. The instructors here have experience from the high school ranks on up to the Major League level. It is the purpose of the Mount Olive College Baseball Camp to make sure that each camper has the opportunity to learn baseball fundamentals from the finest available instructors.

The Mount Olive College baseball program is considered one of the finest programs in the country. The Trojans have won thirteen conference championships in the last fifteen years, and advanced to the South Atlantic Regional's 8 of the last 12 years. The Trojans have also had a number of players sign professional contracts over this period.

It takes a lot of hard work and dedication to build such a tradition. This is a tradition that we have developed over the years and are very proud of. The 2008 season was a year where the Trojans obtained the ultimate goal of winning the National Championship.

Coach Lancaster is also very proud of the Mount Olive College Baseball Camp, which has also become known as one of the most respected in the nation.

Mount Olive College prides itself on offering its campers the hands on personal attention a student deserves. The only requirement is that the campers have a desire to learn, and a will to develop into the very best baseball player they can possibly be.

When you select a baseball camp for your son, you deserve the best. So why not become part of the Mount Olive College tradition in the summer of 2011.

This year we will be implementing the same camp structure as before. We will continue to divide the week of July 24-29, 2011 into two sessions.

**COSTS: DAY STUDENTS COST:** The cost of a day student is \$225, which includes all instruction, camp activities, T-Shirt, lunch, dinner and insurance.

**OVERNIGHT STUDENTS COST:** The cost for a boarding camper is \$275. This fee includes all instruction, activities, meals, room, T-Shirt, and insurance.

### ARRIVAL AT MOUNT OLIVE COLLEGE:

Upon arrival at Mount Olive College, all campers are requested to report to Griffin Hall lobby for registration from 12:00 until 2:00pm on July 24th (session I) and July 27th (session II). After registration the campers will have time to get situated in their rooms before heading to Kornegay Arena for the start of the camp at 2:30pm. If you are unable to arrive during this time, please call and notify the camp director before the registration date. If an emergency develops and you must leave camp early, you must check out with the Camp Director, Coach Lancaster.

### July 24-26: Session I

This session is for campers ages 8 - 12, or those who will still be playing on 60 foot bases the next season. Registration will be held on Sunday July 24th from 12:00 until 2:00pm in the lobby of Griffin Hall. The camp will end with an All Star game at 2:00 pm followed by an Awards Ceremony on Scarborough Field at 4:00 pm on July 26th.

Any camper playing on 90 foot bases next season may we suggest they attend Session II.

### July 27-29: Session II

This session is for campers ages 13 through 18, however, 12 year olds who will be playing on the 90 foot bases should attend this session. Registration will be held on Wednesday July 27th from 12:00 until 2:00pm in the lobby of Griffin Hall. The camp will end with an All Star game at 2:00 pm followed by an Awards Ceremony on Scarborough Field at 4:00 pm on July 29th.

### WHAT EQUIPMENT TO BRING:



All campers need to bring a glove, cleats, tennis shoes, pants, shirts, and personal gear to play baseball. Shorts are okay for some sessions, but baseball pants will be needed for sliding sessions and games. Mount

Olive College Baseball Camp will provide a camp T-shirt, baseballs, bats, and helmets. However, we recommend that catchers bring their own catchers gear. Bringing batting gloves is also encouraged, since the campers will be involved in a lot of hitting drills.

Towels, Washcloths, twin sheets, blankets, pillow and personal items. There is a \$10 refundable key deposit upon return of key at departure.

### **DURING THE WEEK:**



Overnight campers will reside in an air conditioned, on campus dormitory room. Meals for overnight campers will be provided in the on campus dining facility. Rooms will be assigned on the day of registration, and we will honor roommate requests <u>when possible</u>. Five baseball fields are available for camp use, along with the All-Star Batting

Cages in Goldsboro. Campers will have ample training facilities, equipment and quality instruction to further their baseball skills. SUPERVISION IS PROVIDED 24 HOURS A DAY BY RESPONSIBLE STAFF MEMBERS. Medical services are also available around the clock, along with trainers around for camp activities
