Journalism Scholarship (Print and Electronic Media)

The interdisciplinary major in journalism at Muskingum is designed for students interested in a career in either broadcast or print media. The program is designed to provide hands-on skills and experience while also helping the student develop an understanding of the context in which events occur. The Journalism Scholarship is a merit-based financial award for qualified students who wish to take advantage of these opportunities.

Journalism Scholarships range from \$500 to \$1500 per year, with larger awards going to students who demonstrate ability, intend to major in Journalism, and show a higher level of activity and leadership in the field. Smaller awards are available for students who are not majors, but who wish to participate in on-campus journalism-- such as radio, television, or the student newspaper. Scholarships are renewable annually, subject to the eligibility requirements listed below. Financial need is not a requirement, although the Journalism Scholarship is factored into the financial aid package for students demonstrating financial need.

To be considered for the Journalism Scholarship, students must:

- 1. Be admitted to Muskingum College and enroll on a full-time basis.
- 2. Present a portfolio of news clips, articles, or a video/audio tape of a newscast for review by the Muskingum College Journalism faculty. (If you do not have prior published or broadcast samples, consult with faculty members to determine the appropriate material for submission.)
- 3. Submit the attached application form. (The deadline for application is March 1)

To maintain eligibility, a Journalism Scholarship recipient must:

- 1. Maintain a minimum of a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale in journalism courses and a 2.5 average in all college course work.
- 2. Enroll in at least one journalism or media course every semester (including practica).
- 3. Submit a portfolio of news clips (print and/or radio-tv) for annual spring review showing past year's work only.
- 4. Work an average of 3 hours a week for the school newspaper, yearbook, radio or television staffs.

Students may qualify for more than one type of non need-based financial aid, though limitations are placed on the total amount of Muskingum-funded non need-based assistance a student may receive. These limits are outlined in provisions which accompany all scholarships and financial aid awards. Recipients of full-tuition scholarships or remissions are eligible for the Journalism Scholarship award, although no additional monies result.

Applicants who qualify for need-based financial aid may be eligible for assistance beyond the level of the Journalism Scholarship and other non need-based awards. Students planning to apply for need-based assistance should file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submit signed copies of parent and student federal tax forms between January 1 and March 15 of their senior year.
