

Rowan University Alternative Spring Break

Mission Statement

The mission of the alternative spring break program is to promote service on local, regional, national and international levels through volunteer experiences that immerse students in different settings and cultures. Students visit communities where they perform short-term projects while learning about issues such as poverty, educational and cultural literacy, racism, hunger, the environment, homelessness and health related issues. These educational experiences are designed to heighten social awareness and promote lifelong social action and community involvement.

Role of the Participant

Participating in an ASB trip is very rewarding; it also requires commitment and dedication from those involved. Participants are required to attend regular trip meetings, and service projects, where they will get to know their fellow trip members, become educated about their issue, and help plan their trip. After returning, they will also participate in post-winter break meetings, and scheduled service projects.

Trip Descriptions

Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration in Pensacola, Florida March 11th – 17th Total Estimated Cost: \$250-\$300 plus airfare (Deposit: \$150) Volunteers will work with Community Collaborations International (www.communitycollaborations.org) on a variety of environmental projects throughout the week. Environmental projects are designed to build an understanding of coastal ecosystems and watersheds and how they are affected by man-made and natural disasters. Other community based projects are designed to serve families and individuals impacted economically. *An extra cost will be added to this trip for airfare*

Katrina's Kids in New Orleans, Louisiana March 11th – 17th Total Estimated Cost: \$250-\$300 plus airfare (Deposit: \$150) Volunteers will be working with Head Start and Early Head Start centers operated by Total Community Action located in New Orleans providing direct service to pre-school children and support for the overall program. TCA operates Centers throughout the New Orleans area. *An extra cost will be added to this trip for airfare*

The Carolina Tiger Rescue in Pittsboro, North Carolina

March 11th – 17th Total Estimated Cost: \$250-\$300 (Deposit: \$150) The Carolina Tiger Rescue is a nonprofit wildlife sanctuary whose mission is saving and protecting wild cats in captivity and in the wild. Volunteers from the Carolina Tiger Rescue trip will be working with the organization to improve the animal habitats and raise awareness.

Local Outreach in Glassboro & Camden, New Jersey

March 11th – 14th Total Estimated Cost: \$25-75 (Deposit: \$25) Volunteers will immerse themselves in a variety of service opportunities throughout the South Jersey region. Projects will range from working with children to volunteering at the South Jersey Food Bank to working with special-needs adults to outdoor environmental projects. **This trip is designed to run for half the week**
