Eligibility and Admission Requirements

The selection process for acceptance into the Honors College is very competitive and students' applications undergo a thorough and critical review. The sooner the application is submitted, the greater the chances for the applicant to be admitted to the College. First-time freshman applicants must meet or exceed the following standards:

- A completed Honors College application
- One-page typed biography/academic resume
- 3(total) letters of recommendation preferably from English, Math and Science instructors
- Original one page essay on "How you feel the Honors Studies will Increase the Value of Your Undergraduate Education"
- Scholastic Aptitude Test(SAT) and/or American College Test(ACT) scores
- A or B+ average
- 4 units of English
- 2 units of Natural Science
- 2 units of Social Science
- 3 units of Mathematics (Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry and/or comparable sequence)
- Leadership position held
- Special honors received

Because the Honors College is committed to developing the next generation of leaders, strong consideration will also be given to students with demonstrated leadership ability, diverse community and extracurricular activities.

Student Award Categories

When sufficient funding is available, Texas Southern University rewards its Honors College Students with generous educational underwriting.

- **Presidential Honors College Scholar/Valedictorian** full scholarship covering tuition, fees, books and on-campus room and board to be divided 50% for each semester.
- The Provost Honors College Scholar/Salutatorian (2nd ranking) full scholarship covering tuition, fees, books and on-campus room and board to be divided 50% for each semester.
- The Dean Honors College Scholar (3rd ranking) full scholarship covering tuition, fees, books and oncampus room and board to be divided 50% for each semester.
- Level 1 covers 90% of the total. The award is based on a high school grade point average of 3.75 or higher with a ranking in the Top 5% of the class, SAT score of 1600 or higher, or ACT score of 25 or higher. The award is to be divided 50% for each semester.
- Level 2 covers 80% of the total. The award is based on a high school grade point average of 3.50, with a ranking in the top 10% of the class, SAT score of 1450 or higher, or ACT score of 23 or higher. The award is to be divided 50% for each semester.
- Level 3 covers 75% of the total. The award is based on a high school grade point average of 3.40, with a ranking in the top 15% of the class, SAT score of 1350 or higher, or ACT score of 21 or higher. The award is to be divided 50% for each semester.
- Level 4 covers 50% of the total cost. The award is based on a high school grade point average of 3.00 or higher, with a ranking in the top 20% of the class, SAT score of 1250 or higher, ACTS score of 19 or higher. The award is to be divided 50% for each semester.

Scholars Requirements

Once accepted into the Honors College, the responsibility to continue a tradition of academic and professional excellence becomes paramount to the overall success of the student and the University. The student is expected to enroll in the Honors curriculum in each semester of their enrollment and to register for daily tutorial services when needed.

Though rigorous, the standards that must be upheld to remain a scholar in the program build stronger character, instill stricter discipline and inspire more community outreach from our students.

To remain a scholar in **good academic standing**, the following academic and community requirements must be met:

- At least a 3.25 grade point average per semester
- At least a 3.25 cumulative grade point average each academic year
- Completion of 15 credit hours per semester/30 hours each academic year to meet appropriate classification status at the end of each academic year
- · Attendance at the daily study sessions
- Regular participation in community based activities
- Participation in all collegiate and extra-curricular activities sponsored or endorsed by the Honors College, and the University
- Successful participation in internships and summer research programs
- Participation in international studies, research and or internship

The Honors College is proud of its membership with numerous national honor societies and professional organizations. By using our longstanding connections with local and national business and community leaders, the Honors College has established affiliations which provide vital partnerships and professional advice to our students to help ensure post-graduate success.

University Housing

The University strongly believes in safe and comfortable housing for all of its students. With newer residential complexes and an ongoing revival of renovations throughout the historic Third Ward community, Honors College students enjoy an eclectic mix of housing choices with other exceptionally talented and gifted students. Within this cohort environment, students relish the intimacy of creating a community with peers, while also sharing varying cultural and social experiences. University housing is only a short distance from classroom buildings and includes accommodations for students with disabilities.
