Welcome to TEXAS SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY for the 2008-2009 academic year! Information for you to successfully enroll in Texas Southern University is enclosed. New student orientation will be held on Monday, August 18, 2008.

Orientation

Orientation will be held in the Health & Physical Education Building. You should arrive no later than 8:30 a.m. so that you will have ample time to park and find seating. The program will begin promptly at 9:00 a.m.

Directions and Parking

Enclosed are directions to the campus. Once you arrive at the campus, you should park at the West Garage, located on the corner of Ennis and Blodgett Streets. For this meeting no parking permit is required. The Health and Physical Education Building is adjacent to the West Garage parking lot with entrance on the corner of Ennis Street and Wheeler Avenue.

Testing Information

The Texas Success Initiative is required for all Texas state schools. You cannot enroll in classes until you clear these exemptions or requirements. There are two ways to clear the TSI exemptions or requirements:

Testing Exemptions

SAT exemption scores: a combined verbal and mathematics score of 1070 with at least 500 on both the verbal and the mathematics sections (single test date). Scores may not be more than 5 years old at the time of exemption.

ACT exemption scores: a composite score of 23 with at least 19 on both the English and the Mathematics sections (single test date). Scores may not be more than 5 years old at the time of exemption.

TAKS exemption scores: English/Language Arts (ELA) = 2200 with a score of 3 or higher on the written essay, plus a score of 2200 on the mathematics section (exit-level TAKS). Scores may not be more than 3 years old at the time of exemption. (requirement for all Texas High School graduates)

TAAS exemption scores: writing = 1770; mathematics = 86; reading = 89 (single test date). **Scores may not be more than 3 years old at the time of exemption.**

Military exemptions

Active military service - evidence of at least three years of active duty as a member of the US armed forces, the Texas National Guard, or a reserve component of the US armed forces. These three years must immediately precede enrollment. **Prior military service** - evidence of honorable discharge, retirement or release on or after August 1, 1990, from active duty as a member of the U.S. armed forces, the Texas National Guard or a reserve component of the U.S. armed forces.

Testing Requirements

Students who do not fall in any of the above categories must take one of the following tests before they will be allowed to enroll in classes. THEA ASSET COMPASS ACCUPLACER

SUBMITTING YOUR OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT

HIGH SCHOOL OR COLLEGE

Transcripts are considered official only when they bear the signature of the registrar and the seal of the issuing school, show graduation date, and are mailed directly to the TSU Office of Admissions from the registrar's office of each school attended. Hand-carried transcripts from accredited high schools or hand-carried assessments from school districts will be accepted only if they are presented in a sealed envelope and bear the stamp of the issuing institution. TAAS/TAKS exemptions DO NOT qualify for admission (Texas Graduates ONLY). If a transcript is not received by the end of the term, the student will not be allowed to register for future terms and will not be able to receive any further financial aid or scholarships. For transferring students, course credit evaluation information will be mailed directly to the student.

STUDENT FINANGIAL ASSISTANCE

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE APPLICATION PROCESS

The entire financial aid process, from the time you begin applying to the actual awarding of financial aid, may take up to ten weeks. Students are encouraged to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) beginning January 1 of each award year and promptly submit any supporting document(s) immediately upon request.

PRIORITY DEADLINE

The priority deadline for submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and all required supporting documentation is April 15th. Many financial programs are funded on an annual basis and students are advised to submit the FAFSA as close to January 1 as possible. The number of aid applicants normally exceeds the available funding and early applicants have the highest opportunity to receive funding from all available sources.

Applications received after the priority deadline is processed as time and volume permit; however, students may apply throughout the year.

STEPS IN THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROCESS

STEP 1 - APPLY FOR A PIN at www.pin.ed.gov

The PIN Application is for students or parents who would like to receive a PIN to electronically sign the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*

STEP 2 - COMPLETE THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)*

Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is a common application that is used by all schools that award federal student aid. The TSU school code, **003642**, and the signatures must be included to ensure timely delivery of the FAFSA to TSU. The U.S. Department of Education will process the FAFSA and send an electronic copy of the results to the student and TSU within 2 to 4 weeks. You should promptly review the results of the FAFSA known as the Student Aid Report to ensure the application does not require corrections or additional information.

For the most accurate and prompt processing, we recommend the student complete the FAFSA on-line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. If you are unable to complete an electronic application, you may submit a paper FAFSA. Students may order the paper FAFSA on line (maximum 3 per student) at www.edpubs.org or by calling the Federal Student Aid Information Center at 1-800-433-3243. The student should receive the FAFSA within 3 to seven working days. If you can not visit the Office of Student Financial Assistance in person you may request an information packet at https://emservices.tsu.edu/forms/contact.asp.

STEP 3 – IF YOU ARE SELECTED FOR VERIFICATION

If Part 1 of the Student Aid Report (SAR) states you have been selected for the Verification Process, please submit the verification worksheet, a copy of your parent's (if dependent), yours (if independent) or your spouses' (if married) federal income tax return (IRS 1040, 1040A, or 1040EZ) to the Office of Student Financial Assistance. The Verification Worksheet is available at www.em.tsu.edu under the Financial Aid Forms link.

STEP 4 – ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Promptly respond to all requests for additional documents and information. You may also verify any missing documents by accessing your TSU "MY Web" account. Financial aid cannot be awarded until the official FAFSA and all supporting documentation has been received. Once all supporting documentation has been received, your federal tax returns will be compared with the information submitted on the FAFSA for accuracy.



STEP 5 - COMPLETE AUTHORIZATION Form

STEP 6 - PROCESSING TIME

Once your file is complete, the OSFA will review all the forms you submitted to determine your eligibility for grants, Federal Work-Study and loans.

STEP 7 - REVIEW AWARD ONLINE AT em.tsu.edu

Review awards that have been offered.

Federal, State, and University funds provide four types of financial aid: **Grants** are need-based funds and do not have to be repaid.

Loans are federal assistance that may not accumulate interest during in-school periods and must be repaid upon the student's separation from school.

Scholarships are awarded based on grades and other achievements and may or may not be need-based.

Work-study money is need-based and is earned through part-time employment.

STEP 8 - LOAN REQUEST

If your award includes a Federal Stafford Student Loan and you are a first-time Stafford Student Loan borrower,

- Complete the entrance interview <u>on-line</u>, (http://mapping-your-future.org) Once an entrance interview is completed, your loan will be certified within five working days, after certification.
- Select a lender from our preferred lender list.

THINGS TO REMEMBER

DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

All students must be admitted and enrolled at Texas Southern University before any financial aid funds can be disbursed to their accounts. An official high school transcript must be received before aid is disbursed to a student's account. All students must be enrolled in at least six hours for the disbursement of loan funds.

SAP

Satisfactory academic progress must be maintained in order for a student to continue to receive financial aid.

30 DAY HOLDS

All first time loan borrowers and all continuing students who have previously withdrawn within the last semester attended will have their loan funds held for 30 days after the first class date.

PLACEMENT TESTING THEA/ASSET/COMPASS

Effective Fall 2003, university students' academic skills may be assessed using the ASSET, COMPASS, THEA or ACCUPLACER tests. Incoming Texas Southern University students who are not otherwise exempted by law are recommended to attempt either the ASSET or THEA test for placement purposes. Education majors may attempt only the THEA test for admission into the College of Education. Placement testing allows the university to effectively educate all students by providing a "roadmap" of each student's strengths and weaknesses.

Students who do not meet the minimum requirement for the multiple-choice portion of the Writing assessment but who earn a score of "6" or higher on the essay will be considered as having passed the Writing section.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students transferring to public institutions from out-of-state or private institutions who have earned grades of "C" or higher in courses approved by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to satisfy placement requirements will not have to take the area(s) in question on a placement test.

TRANSIENT STUDENTS (SUMMER TERM ONLY)

Students enrolled at private or out-of-state institutions who enroll temporarily at Texas institutions may be exempted from placement testing requirements during the summer semester enrollment.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

All degree-seeking international students must adhere to all policies and procedures discussed herein.

SATISFACTORY COMPLETION EXEMPTION POLICY

Students who have attempted a placement test and have earned a non-passing score that falls within a predetermined deviation of the minimum score are eligible to pursue the Satisfactory Completion Exemption for the section in question (Reading, Mathematics or Writing). Upon approval from GUALAC personnel, the student must enroll in a subject specific college-level course approved by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and a GUAC Interdisciplinary Laboratory (GUAC Lab) concurrently. When the student earns a grade of at least a "C" and completes all prescribed GUAC Lab coursework, the student will receive an exemption for the section.

Composite - 23 English - 19 Mathematics - 19 (single test date) (Valid for five years from test date)

TAKS SCORES (Exit-Level)

English/Language Arts (ELA) - 2200 Mathematics - 2200 Writing - 3 (Valid for three years from test date)

TAAS SCORES

Writing - 1770 Mathematics - 86 Reading - 89 (single test date) (Valid for three years from test date)

Students who enroll in Satisfactory Completion Exemption courses without approval will not be able to use the course to satisfy the exemption requirements.

The purpose of the orientation is to provide new students with a smooth and helpful transition to college life. Orientation is mandatory for all First time freshman and transfer students new to Texas Southern University.





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BACTERIAL MENINGITIS

Bacterial meningitis is a serious, potentially deadly disease that can progress extremely fast – so take utmost caution. It is an inflammation of the membranes that surround the brain and spinal cord. The bacteria that cause meningitis can also infect the blood. This disease strikes about 3,000 Americans each year, including 100-125 on college campuses, leading to 5-15 deaths among college students every year. There is a treatment, but those who survive may develop severe health problems or disabilities.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

High fever	Severe headache	Stiff neck

Bash or purple patches on skin (caused by bleeding under the skin)		

The more symptoms, the higher the risk. When these symptoms appear, seek immediate medical attention.

HOW IS BACTERIAL MENINGITIS DIAGNOSED?

Diagnosis is made by a medical provider and is usually based on a combination of clinical symptoms and laboratory results from spinal fluid and blood tests. Early diagnosis and treatment can greatly improve the likelihood of recovery.

HOW IS THE DISEASE TRANSMITTED?

The disease is transmitted when people exchange saliva (such as by kissing or by sharing drinking containers, utensils, cigarettes, toothbrushes, etc.) or come in contact with respiratory or throat secretions.

HOW DO YOU INCREASE YOUR RISK OF GETTING BACTERIAL MENINGITIS?

Your risk is increased through exposure to saliva by sharing cigarettes, water bottles, eating utensils, food, kissing, etc., or by living in close conditions (such as sharing a

room/suite in a dorm or group home).

WHAT ARE THE POSSIBLE CONSEQUENCES OF THE DISEASE?

Death (in 8 to 24 hours from seemingly healthy to dead) Permanent brain damage Limb damage (fingers, toes, arms, legs) that require amputation Coma

Hearing loss, blindness Gangrene Kidney failure Learning disability Convulsions

CAN THE DISEASE BE TREATED?

- Antibiotic treatment, if received early, can save lives and increase chances of recovery. However, permanent disability or death can still occur.
- Vaccinations are available and should be considered for those living in close quarters and for college students 25 years old or younger.
- Vaccinations are effective against four of the five most common bacterial types that cause 70% of the disease in the United States (but do not protect against all types of meningitis).
- Vaccinations take seven to ten days to become effective, with protection lasting three to five years.
- The cost of vaccine varies, so check with your health-care provider.
- Vaccination is very safe. Most common side effects are redness and minor pain at injection site for up to two days.
