On July 30, 2006 at 6:00pm, section leaders, drum major candidates, all freshmen and transfer or 1st year band students are required to report to Rhinehart Auditorium (at the corner of Cleburne and Ennis streets) for a briefing. Bring church attire (we will attend church as a group on Sunday, August 6th and 13th) and bring swimsuits for a tentative pool party during the week. On August 6th at 6pm all returning band students ("old heads") will report to Rhinehart Auditorium for a briefing. We will all attend church as a group on the August 13th.

All first year band members who plan to reside in campus housing, are <u>required</u> to reside in the *University <u>Dormitories</u>* for the Fall and Spring Semesters 2006-2007. You will be allowed to check in on July 30, 2006 between the hours of 12 Noon and 4:00 P.M. All dormitory housing students please adjust your schedule to check in at Lanier East or West next to the *Student Center* between the designated times. <u>ALL</u> University Housing residents must contact Mrs. Hunter (by returning your band camp form) by July 1, 2006 to have your name placed on a list to be allowed to enter housing on July 30th. KKΨ and TBΣ we will need your help. ALL BAND MEMBERS WHO WILL BE LIVING IN UNIVERSITY HOUSING (Lanier West & East Dormitory, Courtyard/Tierwester Oaks I, II, III & Greystone) MUST MAKE ARRANGEMENTS (<u>DEPOSIT</u> & APPLICATION) PRIOR TO YOUR ARRIVAL TO CAMPUS. Please contact the University Residence Hall Director, Mr. John Forbin at (713) 313-7206 for application packets and assistance.

ALL BAND MEMBERS ARE REQUIRED TO ENROLL IN UNIVERSITY BAND and some band grant recipients are also required to enroll in APPLIED LESSONS (please see Band Financial Assistance Agreement Form). Please adhere to these requirements during registration. Failure to properly register may affect your band grant and travel with University Band.

Please return the enclosed band camp forms *immediately*!!! We must receive all band camp registration forms by <u>July 1, 2006</u> so that we may prepare for your arrival. The University Band will provide three meals per day beginning **July 30 2006**, for band members with a <u>Dormitory (not apartment)</u> Housing Assignment. Apartment dwellers are responsible for their meals. <u>Those students who return Band Camp Registration after July 1, 2006 may experience difficulties with room and board for Band Camp</u>. Please contact Mrs. Marbre Hunter, Band Office Coordinator at 713-313-7336, if you need additional information concerning band camp.

All freshmen who have a minimum of a 3.2 grade point average, graduating in the top 10% of your class or have a minimum of one thousand **SAT** or twenty **ACT** scores should contact **Mrs. Linda Coach-Riley in the Honors Program Office at (713) 313-7458.** You may be eligible for a substantial academic scholarship.

 - Band Travel Uniform (Windsuit with "OCEAN" logo) \$60

• Instrument Rental Fee - For all students who will use university instruments- \$35 Please see instrument section information below

Payment to be made by check or money order only (no cash). Please make check payable to TSU Band.

- 2. <u>All new (1st Year) band students</u> must have more than one plain white (all white, crew neck, no pockets, no V-neck, designs, or pictures) T- shirt. "Tall T-Shirts" are not acceptable!! You will need to wear a white T-shirt daily. Black athletic/basketball shorts or jogging pants. <u>THIS IS PART OF YOUR REHEARSAL UNIFORM!! These items may be purchased at any Wal-Mart store. No cut-off sleeves will be accepted!</u>
- 3. <u>All band members (old & new)</u> are required to have. <u>White (without color or design)</u> Tennis shoes and white socks for rehearsal. <u>THIS IS PART OF YOUR REHEARSAL AND ALTERNATE PERFORMANCE UNIFORMS!!</u>
- 4. <u>All band members</u> are required to have plain black military or Oxford shoes WITH A HEEL. This is a part of the Band performance uniform. Black combat boots with a heel are acceptable and preferable for ankle support.
- 5. <u>All 2nd-4th year band students are required to wear steel gray Fruit of the Loom or Haynes t-shirts and black athletic/basketball shorts or jogging sweatpants for ALL rehearsals. These items may be purchased at any Wal-Mart store. No cut-off sleeves will be accepted!</u>
- 6. ALL BAND MEMBERS are required to have white athletic socks (MORE THAN ONE PAIR PLEASE!!!)

ALL BAND MEMBERS are required to bring a hat or cap (not a sun visor) of your choice for outside rehearsals

7. **Woodwinds** – You must have access to a personal instrument. All saxophone and clarinet players are required to have plastic reeds. You may purchase the brand of your choice. **Piccolos** will be

provided for all flute players. Be prepared to pay rental fee (\$35). Please contact Professor Joseph Evans for woodwind information (713) 313-7360.

8. Brass – All **brass** players must have your personal mouthpiece, valve oil, and slide cream. **Trumpet** players must have access to an instrument. The University will supply Mellophones, Baritone Horns, and Sousaphones for a \$35 instrument rental fee to be paid upon arrival at band camp. **If you are a music major/minor and trumpet or French Horn is your major instrument,** please contact Richard F. Lee at <u>Lee rf@tsu.edu</u> for additional equipment and method books/music requirements.

Sousaphone Players - all freshman sousaphone players **must purchase a neck and tuning bits to fit a King Sousaphone** prior to band camp (neck and tuning bits will not be provided by Texas Southern University). First year and returning students, be prepared to pay a \$35 instrument rental fee (no instrument will be assigned without payment of instrument rental fees). Sousaphone players must perform on a Conn Hellenberg sousaphone mouthpiece. Music Majors see below!

Trombone Players - All Trombone players must have an F-attachment Trombone. In addition, all trombone players must perform on a Vincent Bach 6 1/2al. Music majors see below!

Baritone Players - - all baritone players must have a (small shank) Vincent Bach 6 1/2al mouthpiece to fit a Marching Baritone. Be prepared to pay an instrument rental fee of \$35 upon arrival to band camp (no instrument will be assigned without payment of instrument rental fees). Music majors see below!

If you have any further questions, please contact Mr. Clarence Gibson, low brass coordinator, at gibsonck@tsu.edu . If you are a music major/minor, contact Mr. Gibson for additional equipment needs, as well as method books/music that you will have to obtain prior to band camp.

9. Percussion: — First year and returning students, be prepared to pay a \$75 percussion fee (except cymbal players). This includes the cost of instrument rental. In addition you will have to purchase your sticks, mallets, straps, gloves, etcetera. You may bring your old sticks, mallets, etcetera but you should wait until your final instrument assignment to purchase new equipment. Please remember that while you may try out on a particular instrument, you may be assigned to any instrument by the percussion instructor. Once assigned to a drum/instrument, you are responsible for the equipment associated with that instrument.

- Tenor Drum Ludwig Bass Sling (Black) 350B \$25; Ludwig L2333 Tenor Drum Mallets \$35.00
- Bass Drum Ludwig Bass Sling (Black) 350B \$25; American Drum BJ3 Large Black Jack Bass Drum mallet \$44.00
- Cymbal Players We use 20" Sabian heavy marching cymbals. To use university owned cymbals, you will have to pay a \$150 cymbal fee.

These prices are for equipment obtained through the band and are subject to change without notice. You may purchase the equipment on your own but it **must be the specified equipment.**

If you have any further questions, please contact Mr. Darryl Singleton, percussion coordinator, at singletondm@tsu.edu. If you are a music major/minor, contact Mr. Singleton for additional equipment needs, as well as method books/music that you will have to obtain.

10. Auxiliary Units (Majorettes, Flags & Twirlers) — Be prepared to purchase your boots (Approximately \$75). Members of these squads may elect to purchase an additional uniform(s) for special performances. For more information, please contact Ms. Detria Ward, Majorette Advisor at (713) 313-6815, Mrs. Linda Coach-Riley, Colorguard Advisor at (713) 313-7458 and Doris Keener Twirler Advisor at (713) 729-4885. Additional information will be distributed at the first meeting on July 30, 2006 at 6:00 P.M.

<u>All instrumentalists</u> (except percussion & sousaphones) must purchase a combination (or key) lock to store your instrument in lockers. <u>Bring the lock with you</u>.

11. ALL BAND MEMBERS must have the required completed medical form (signed by your doctor) BEFORE you will be allowed to attend any rehearsals or perform with the band.

<u>12. ALL BAND MEMBERS</u> (<u>INCLUDING AUXILARY SQUADS</u>) are required to wear a sturdy backpack (size & shape of your choice) <u>with padded straps</u> with a minimum of three (3) liters of water for all outdoor rehearsals. This is part of the rehearsal dress code.

MEDICAL EXAMINATION

<u>ALL BAND MEMBERS</u> are required to have a physical examination by the doctor of your choice before you will be allowed to attend any band rehearsals or perform with the band. <u>No physical exams</u> <u>will be given on campus</u>. Failure to submit the signed medical form (see form on line) by the first meeting will place your band scholarship in jeopardy (the waiting list for band scholarships is extensive) and you will be unable to participate in any band activities.

UNIVERSITY HOUSING

ALL FRESHMEN(1ST YEAR) BAND MEMBERS WHO PLAN TO RESIDE IN UNIVERSITY HOUSING WILL BE REQUIRED TO LIVE IN LANIER HALL EAST (MEN) OR WEST (WOMEN). Please access university housing on line at www.em.tsu.edu.(Click on New Student, click on housing, complete housing assignment form and click on submit). Failure to submit housing information in a timely manner may cause the following to occur: 1) a delay in obtaining housing 2) being placed on a waiting list for housing 3) a time-consuming and somewhat expensive search for alternative housing. Please be sure to submit your application AND DEPOSIT as soon as possible to reserve your room. If you have not applied yet, please call University Housing for a full application packet at (713) 313-7206. Second through fourth year band students may choose to reside in the Greystone Apartments or the Courtyard/Tierwester Oaks Apartments. Please contact Ms. Latreva Herndon(herndonld@yahoo.com) at (713) 526-2232 for the Greystone apartment application and Contact Ms. Khrysten Encalarde (uchouston@ambling.com) at (713) 520-0533 for the Courtyard/Tierwester Oaks and Richfield Manor Apartments applications. Please let Ms. Herndon and Encalarde know that you are in the band. All band students planning to live in dormitory housing please be prepared to check in after 12 Noon on July 30th (Freshmen & Transfer Students Only) and August 7th (Returning Students). You must have applications and deposits on file with University Housing and apartment offices before you check into your room. Also please let us know where you will reside on the "Band Camp Registration" form.

POUCY ON HAZING

There is no form of hazing allowed in the Texas Southern University band program. Anyone found to be involved in a case of hazing will be dismissed from the band program. No band member has the authority to threaten another member's status in the band.

Along with being in good standing with the University, the audition process is the only formality that is required for membership to the band. The directors will administerall training programs.

Frequently Asked Questions about "Ocean of Soul" Band Camp

What is a Band Grant? - Financial Assistance provided in the form of a scholarship/grant to perform in University Band

How do I know if I have a Band Grant? – You will receive a document via US postal service entitled "Band Financial Assistance Agreement" stating the amount you will receive.

How do I apply for a Band Grant? You must audition in person or by video tape. Please see the band website at WWW.TSU.EDU/BANDS for audition requirements.

What is a Band Financial Assistance Agreement Form? It is acknowledgement of the amount of financial assistance being recommended for your performance in University Band.

If I am trying out for Majorette, Color Guard or Twirler during Leadership Camp do I still need to return my Band Camp information by July 1, even if I don't know if I will make it? – YES!

What do I do if I am a freshman and have already applied for housing in the University Apartments? Please inform the apartment manager that you are in the band and contact the band director as soon as possible.

Why is the Band not providing lunches for people who live in apartments during Band Camp? The students residing in the dormitories will be on the University meal plan and the student living in apartments have elected to provide their own meals.

I am a freshman in the honors program and they say I have to stay in the Apartments. What do I do? Please contact the Band Director as soon as possible..
