### UMC Children's Hospital/Children's Miracle Network

The UMC Children's Hospital is a proud partner of Children's Miracle Network. Through this partnership, UMC and CMN have been able to provide state-ofthe-art medical equipment and comprehensive services to the children of the South Plains and Eastern New Mexico for over 27 years. The UMC Children's Hospital is the only Children's Burn Intensive Care Unit in the region and leads the area in trauma services. They also have a 40 bed Level 3 Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. 100% of the funds raised will stay local.

#### **Refuge Services**

Established in 1999, Refuge Services is a community sponsored non-profit organization that has provided a therapeutic setting for physical, occupational, speech-language, or licensed mental health professionals to incorporate horses into their treatment plan. Among the equine-assisted therapies provided, Refuge Services offers hippotherapy, therapeutic riding, and equine-assisted psychotherapy to individuals of all ages in Lubbock and area communities in an accepting and supportive Christian environment.

# Special Olympics

Through the area office in Lubbock, Special Olympics serves over 633 athletes across the South Plains. By providing year-round sports training and athletic competitions in a variety of Olympic-type sports, Special Olympics gives children and adults with intellectual disabilities continual opportunities to develop physical fitness and improve their quality of life.

# Texas Boys Ranch

Since its beginning in 1975, Texas Boys Ranch has offered a structured and stable family environment for over 800 boys ages 4 through 18. Each boy is provided training in social skills, personal finances, health and safety, home economics, and community service while living with two host parents and up to seven other boys. A strong work ethic is also fostered as the boys complete daily chores on the 440-acre working ranch. Texas Boys Ranch also provides tutoring as needed outside of the boys' education at Roosevelt Independent School District, as well as a comprehensive therapeutic counseling program.
