PART-TIME STUDENTS

- 7 semesters of 8 or more credits and 2 summers of 5 credits each and 1 summer of 3 credits AND
- 2.70 LGPA by end of Spring semester of 3rd year of law school OR
- 2.70 LGPA by end of last semester of law school.

Substantial Skills Requirement

Effective February 2, 2006, law school faculty adopted a new upper-level skills requirement for every student, effective with the entering class of Fall 2005.

Each student is already required to take Civil Procedure I and II, Legal Analysis, Research and Writing I and II, Advanced Legal Research, and Legal Drafting. Effective with the entering class of 2005, students are required to take at least 2 additional credits of upper-level skills instruction, selected from a designated menu of courses identified as skills-centered.
