

#### Residency

- Apply to the schools in your home state
- Applying out of the state?
  - Do those schools accept non-residents?

Eliminate schools that <u>do not accept</u> nonresidents or accept in <u>very low percentages</u>.

#### Focus Population

- Some schools cater to a specific:
  - Ethnic group
  - Religion

Eliminate schools that are not for you.

#### Curriculum

- Law
  - Socratic method
  - Case studies
  - Lecture

- Medicine
  - Standard
  - Problem-based learning (PBL)
  - System-based
  - Hybrid
- Chiropractic Medicine
  - Straight
  - Reform
  - Mixer

#### Focus

- Medicine
  - Research
  - Clinical
  - Service-based

- Law
  - Geography

#### Areas of Strength

- Examples:
  - Richardson School of Law:
    - Environmental law
  - John A. Burns School of Medicine
    - Tropical Diseases



#### Step 1: Create columns


- Score of entrance exam



Long List	Short list
Created through utilizing the 7 Initial Factors	Created using entrance exam score, GPA, and budget
~30-50 schools (Medicine) ~80-90 schools (Law) Varies in other health programs	Depends on your budget
Only created once	Re-created each application cycle
Start building about a year before application cycle	Constructed between when you receive exam score and when you apply
