SUMMER HIGHLIGHTS

UMUC SIGNS ARTICULATION AGREEMENT WITH FAES



UMUC recently entered into an agreement with the Foundation for Advanced Education in the Sciences (FAES), an independent organization that provides continuing education programs to the employees of the National Institutes of Health (NIH). The agreement offers NIH employees who complete the FAES certificate in Technology Transfer the opportunity to transfer all 15 certificate credits toward a UMUC Master of Science degree.



"FAES certificate students can choose from UMUC's graduate degree programs in biotechnology studies, information technology, management, and technology management," said Michael Evanchik, PhD, associate dean for strategic planning at UMUC's Graduate School of Management and Technology. "These programs all offer a choice of specializations and—for just an additional 18 credits—can also be paired with an MBA as part of UMUC's very popular dual degree program."

FAES offers almost 200 career-related courses at NIH each year that are certified for credit by the Maryland Higher Education Commission. The majority of these courses are in the biomedical field, reflecting the type of work done by NIH, one of the world's foremost medical research centers.

In addition to fostering the sharing of knowledge among some of the most prominent members of the science community in the United States, FAES supports educational programs for their own graduate school, conferences, biotechnology training (Bio-Trac) courses, and a summer program for high school students. Other services include a bookstore, health insurance, cultural arts, and a Social and Academic Center.

"FAES and UMUC are currently exploring other collaborative educational programs for NIH," Evanchik added.

BOOZ ALLEN HAMILTON PARTNERS WITH UMUC FOR CYCBERSECURITY TRAINING

In a newly formed industry partnership, UMUC has agreed to provide graduate-level cybersecurity training to the workforce of Booz Allen Hamilton.

The partnership will offer Booz Allen employees a time-efficient and cost-effective opportunity to take courses and complete one of three UMUC graduate certificates—Foundations of Cybersecurity, Cybersecurity Policy, or Cybersecurity Technology. All credits earned for a certificate can also be applied to a UMUC master's degree program—in cybersecurity or cybersecurity policy by those employees who wish to continue their education and career development. The program will enroll cohorts of up to 25 Booz Allen employees over a period of two to three semesters.

"Our nation's ability to successfully protect our critical infrastructure and information systems from attacks hinges on a trained, ready cyber workforce," said J. Michael (Mike) McConnell, executive vice president at Booz Allen. "At a time when the public- and private-sector gaps in cyber professionals are cavernous, we are pleased to partner with UMUC to deliver a program aimed at fortifying this workforce."

"Booz Allen Hamilton has been a leader in cyber consulting for over a decade," said UMUC President Susan C. Aldridge, PhD, "and UMUC looks forward to providing their employees with cuttingedge training that addresses the evolving needs of their clients in the technology market."

TUITION INFORMATION

One of the key values that drives UMUC is affordability. Not only does UMUC make sure that the tuition rates listed below are competitive, the university also helps you find ways to afford the cost of your education.

Tuition and Fees

Due at Time of Registration

All tuition and fees are due at the time of registration, unless you

- 1. Applied for financial aid to cover tuition and fees for this session;
- Enrolled in UMUC's interest-free monthly payment plan (to find out more, visit www.umuc.edu/payoptions); or
- 3. Provide confirmation that you will receive employer-provided tuition assistance

Payment is expected by the due date. If UMUC has not received your payment in full, your registration may be canceled. *Note*: Not paying for a course does not relieve you of your financial obligation to the university.

Mandatory Technology Fee

A technology fee of \$13 per credit is charged at the time of registration to improve the institutional information technology infrastructure and help fund technological advancements and tools to enhance the student experience. The fee is capped at \$312 per year (which runs summer/fall/spring). See Additional Fees for details.

Note: In accordance with UMUC and the Board of Regents, all students who fail to pay charges incurred with UMUC will be transferred to the State Central Collection Unit. Additionally, UMUC has received authorization from the Board of Regents to charge students' delinquent accounts a 17 percent collection fee and/or all attorney and court costs incurred by the university. Once a past due balance with UMUC has been transferred to the State Central Collection Unit, students' information will be forwarded to the credit bureau.

Requests for services (e.g., transcripts, diplomas, commencement arrangements, transfer credit review) may be denied until all debts are paid in full. All graduate students are required to pay graduate tuition for all graduate courses in which they are enrolled.

Payment Options

Monthly Tuition Payment Plan

UMUC offers an interest-free, monthly tuition-payment plan administered by Sallie Mae. The plan allows you to spread all or part of your tuition bills into monthly installments on a session basis, thus providing greater financial flexibility. All UMUC students are eligible to participate in the payment plan, regardless of financial need. Refund Policy

The official date used to determine a refund is the date of the drop transaction, the date the withdrawal form is filed at the Information Desk at the UMUC Academic Center at Largo or the postmarked date on a written request. The official date for federal financial aid recipients is the last date of class attendance as determined by federal regulations.

Withdrawals and Financial Aid

Financial aid awards may be canceled or reduced for financial aid recipients who withdraw from classes. Financial aid recipients should check with a financial aid advisor when withdrawing from a course to determine the impact on their awards. Refund for Course Cancellations

The university refunds 100 percent of tuition and technology fees for courses canceled by the university. The application fee is nonrefundable, even when a course is canceled.

Note: Technology fees may be refunded to military students only proportionate to the percentage of tuition refunded.

For classes in 10-week sessions or longer, tuition is refunded as follows:

100%	Withdrawal before the class start date
75%	Withdrawal 1–13 calendar days after a class starts
50%	Withdrawal 14–20 calendar days after a class starts
0%	Withdrawal 21 or more calendar days after a class starts

Students who withdraw on the first day of class are not eligible for a 100 percent refund. *Please note*: This policy applies only to students not receiving federal financial aid.

Federal Return of Funds Policy


