RESIDUAL CHECK DELIVERY STATEMENT

The UNA Business Office will process and distribute residual checks to those students who have received more credits applied to their student account than is needed to pay their total charges. Students should allow five (5) business days from the date classes begin for the first mailing of residual checks. Thereafter, residual checks will be disbursed approximately five (5) business days from the date the funds are posted to the student’s account.

All residual checks will be mailed to the student’s campus mailbox, if the student has a campus mailbox, or to the student’s home address if the student has no campus mailbox. The Business Office does not hold checks for pickup.

EFFECT OF WITHDRAWAL ON RESIDUAL CHECKS

If you have received a residual check and withdraw from any course(s), you may owe a portion or all of the residual amount back to the UNA Business Office. You may consult with the Office of Student Financial Services in room 206-B to determine the effect(s) of withdrawing from any course(s).

Summer Admission

New Students

The University of North Alabama welcomes high school graduates or anyone with satisfactory GED exam results.

Applications for Admission are available in Coby Hall, on the UNA campus or may be requested by calling **(256) 765-4608**.

To be eligible to register for the 2010 Summer Term, the following credentials must be on file in the Office of Admissions prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**:

1. *A completed Application for Admission along with the \$25.00 application fee (Application fee not required for students who have previously attended UNA.)*
2. *Official high school transcripts or GED scores.*
3. *Official SAT or ACT scores.*

New students who previously applied to UNA but did not register must update their admission status for the 2010 Summer Term prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**, in order to register during the 2010 Summer Term. Contact the Office of Admissions for instructions.

Transfer Students

Any degree seeking student with prior college-level work from another institution may obtain an Application for Admission in Coby Hall on the UNA campus or request an application by calling **(256) 765-4608**.

To be eligible to register for the 2010 Summer Term, the following credentials must be on file in the Office of Admissions, UNA Box 5011, Florence, AL 35632, prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**:

1. *A completed Application for Admission along with the \$25.00 application fee. (Application Fee not required for students who previously attended UNA.)*
2. *Official transcripts (these transcripts must be sent directly to UNA's Office of Admissions) from each college previously attended.*

Transfer students who previously applied to UNA but who did not register must update their admission status for the 2010 Summer Term prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**, in order to register during the 2010 Summer Term. Contact the Office of Admissions for instructions.

Former Students

Any former UNA student who does not enroll for a Fall or Spring semester must reapply for admission. Those students who attend during a Spring semester, and do not enroll during the Summer Term, may return for the Fall semester *without* reapplying for admission.

The application fee is not required for any former student returning to UNA. Any former student who wishes to register for the 2010 Summer Term must reapply prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**.

Former students who previously applied to UNA but did not register **must** update their admission status for the 2010 Summer Term prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**, in order to register during the 2010 Summer Term. Contact the Office of Admissions for instructions.

Special Students

Any non-degree seeking student who wishes to enroll in classes at UNA during the **2010 Summer Term** must have the following credentials on file in the Office of Admissions prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**:

1. A completed Application for Admission along with the \$25.00 application fee. (Application Fee not required for students who previously attended UNA.)
2. Transient Students-letter of good standing from the college currently attending. MBA Prerequisites, Teacher Certification and Nontraditional fifth-year prerequisites-official transcripts from all previously attended institutions. Other special classifications--official transcript from last college attended and, if Bachelors degree earned, official transcript from institution from which degree was earned.
3. If no previous college attendance, official high school transcript or GED scores.

Applications are available on the UNA campus in Coby Hall, or by calling (256) 765-4608.

Special students who previously applied to UNA but did not register must update their admission status with the Office of Admissions to the 2010 Summer Term prior to **Friday, May 21, 2010**, in order to register during the 2010 Summer Term. Contact the Office of Admissions for instructions.

Early Scholars

High school juniors and seniors who rank above average in academic achievement may, upon the written recommendation of their principals or guidance counselors, be admitted for approved coursework. The following credentials must be on file in the Office of Admissions by **April 15, 2010**.

1. A completed Application for Admission along with the \$25.00 application fee.
2. Early scholar approval form signed by the high school principal or guidance counselor listing the approved UNA course numbers and titles.
3. Official high school transcript.

Early scholars who are high school juniors or seniors are allowed to enroll in up to five hours per semester at no cost, on a space available basis. Cost definition includes tuition only. Early scholars are still subject to any special fees. Students in Grades 7-9 certified in writing as gifted by the local superintendent of education may be admitted for approved coursework.

NOTE: An Early Scholar approval form **MUST** be filed with the Office of Admissions **BEFORE EACH** semester or term. Forms can be obtained from your high school guidance counselor or the Office of Admissions.

Graduate Students

Any student wishing to apply for admission to a UNA graduate program must have an application, transcripts, and all other credentials for the desired program of study on file with the Office of Admissions **at least two work weeks prior to registration**. The application fee is \$25.00. For graduate admission assistance, call (256) 765-4608.

Student Financial Aid Summer 2010

Application. Financial aid is available for Summer 2010. Summer awards are based on the 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To be considered for summer financial aid, find your enrollment category below and follow the steps.

If you were enrolled at UNA in Fall 2009 or Spring 2010. . .

Note: If you have not already applied for 2009-2010 financial aid, you must file the FAFSA. Allow 3-4 weeks processing.

If you have not attended UNA or any other college in 2009-2010 . . .

- ✓ Complete FAFSA, available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Allow 3-4 weeks processing.
- ✓ Check UNA Portal for any outstanding requirements.

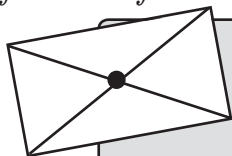
PRIORITY DATE: April 15, 2010. If you complete all steps by April 15, 2010, you can expect a financial aid award letter by May 15, 2010. If this is your first loan at UNA, you will be required to sign a Master Promissory Note (MPN) and complete loan counseling requirements. Please check UNA Portal for outstanding requirements.

Financial Aid and Payment of Registration Fees. Financial aid awards (except work study) may be used to defer full or partial payment of registration fees. Payment may be deferred for a reasonable period of time, then is due, even if financial aid has not been delivered.

Late Financial Aid Applications. UNA will accept and process summer financial aid applications through June 2010. However, applications received after April 15, 2010, may not be processed in time to defer payment.

Miscellaneous Expenses. All financial aid applicants should be prepared to provide for miscellaneous expenses, including cost of living and books and supplies, while their applications are in-process.

Student Financial Aid Summer 2010

Enrollment Status. For financial aid purposes, full-time enrollment for summer requires at least 12 undergraduate hours, 9 graduate hours, half-time enrollment at least 6 hours.

- ✓ Pell Grant awards are based on enrollment status.
- ✓ Stafford/PLUS loans require half-time enrollment status.
- ✓ If enrollment status changes after awards have been made, awards may be revised or cancelled.

Grade Level Classification. If you advance from freshman to sophomore, from sophomore to junior, from undergraduate to graduate at the end of Spring 2010, you may be eligible for additional Stafford loan funds. Contact UNA Student Financial Services after you receive your Spring 2010 grades.

IMPORTANT CHANGE IN FEDERAL STUDENT LOANS EFFECTIVE SUMMER 2010.

Effective with the Summer 2010 semester, UNA will participate in the Federal Direct Loan Program. ALL student loan borrowers will have to complete a new Master Promissory Note (MPN) with the Department of Education. This applies to new borrowers, as well as students who have previously borrowed from other lenders. Instructions for signing your eMPN with the Department of Education are available online at www.una.edu/financial-aid and in our office Room 206B, Bibb Graves Hall.

Student Loan Funds. Student loan funds (subsidized and unsubsidized Stafford) are transferred electronically from the Department of Education to UNA. To receive credit for loan funds you must:

- ✓ Be registered for at least 6 hours
- ✓ Be eligible for type, amount sent by lender
- ✓ Complete all steps to secure your loan funds

- ✓ All first-time, beginning freshman students will have a 30-day delay on the delivery of their Stafford loan funds.

Residual Aid Checks. All financial aid funds, except work study, are credited to your individual student account. If your payments and financial aid credits exceed your charges, the residual amount will be issued to you in the form of a UNA check. Residual aid checks are written on a regular, timely schedule by the UNA Business Office. See page 3 for details.

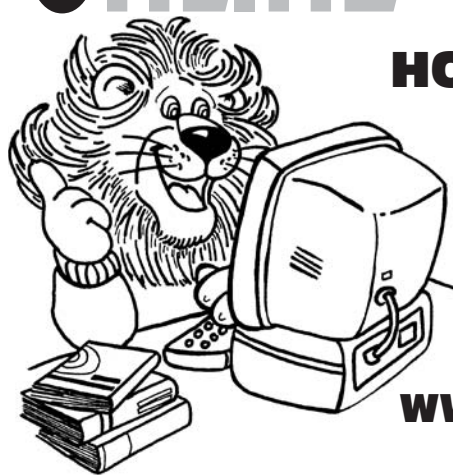

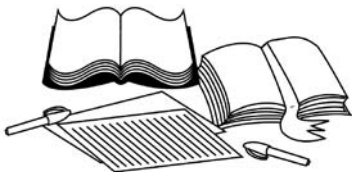
