Required Curriculum for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing - **January** Accelerated Track (BSN-AT)

A course of study for individuals with a BA or BS degree, who upon completion of the 16-month program, will earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

Admission Requirements

- A cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.7 or higher (on a 4.0 scale)(the *minimum* GPA of 2.7 does not guarantee admission to the program)
- Grade of C or better in all prerequisite courses

- A BA or BS (or higher) degree from an accredited institution completed by May of the year prior to beginning program in January
- A written summary of any community, volunteer or health-related experience
- Completion of the TEAS V Assessment (fee) administered by the Department of Nursing

- Official college transcripts from all colleges attended
- Completed application to William Jewell College
- Completed Nursing Supplement
- Application deadline is **March 1** of the year prior to the January term for which you are applying

- Two letters of recommendation (academic or professional) that address the candidate's character and ability to complete an intensive course of study
- An interview with members of the Department of Nursing
- Candidates are considered on the basis of GPA, completed prerequisites, interview, letters of recommendation, and healthcare and volunteer experience
