#### **SECTION ONE: APPLICANT INFORMATION**

- Address: All correspondence will go to the address you specify on your application. It is <u>YOUR</u> <u>RESPONSIBILITY</u> to inform staff at The San Diego Foundation of any changes to your address, phone number(s), e-mail address, etc.
- Social Security Number (this is required) your application will not be processed without it (page 10).
- ❖ Ethnicity: If you are applying for an ethnic-specific scholarship, this field is required. List what you consider to be your primary ethnicity first and then any others that describe you.
- Residency: All applicants must be residents of San Diego County (unless criteria states otherwise). Residency is required for one year beginning November 2010 and is defined as the city and state where the applicant's or parents'/guardians' taxes are filed. Active military personnel and their dependents are the exception.
- ❖ <u>School</u>: Please list your <u>first choice school for fall 2011</u> schools must be accredited or licensed. Since some of our scholarships are specific to a particular school or geographic region, your first choice school will determine your eligibility for these scholarships. If you do not list a school or list more than one school, your application will be considered incomplete and you will not be considered for our scholarships.

#### **REQUIRED SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION:**

#### Letters of Recommendation:

- Ask two people who know you well, but are not related to you, to write your letters of recommendation. NOTE: please give the individuals writing your letters adequate time.
- Teachers, counselors, religious leaders, coaches, and employers are all good choices for letters of recommendation as they can comment on your overall character, achievement and promise.
- Letters must be on official letterhead and written within the last year. If official letterhead is unavailable, letters can be submitted on plain stationery but must provide the recommending person's name, organization, address, and/or a phone number or e-mail address where they can be reached. Letters must include the date written, your full name, name of the person recommending you, his/her relationship to you, in what capacity they have known you, and for how long. All letters must be signed by the person recommending you.

#### ❖ Official Transcripts

- Official transcripts <u>MUST</u> accompany your scholarship application (unless you are an adult reentry student not currently attending school). Transcripts may be submitted from a high school applicant's junior year if a transcript with current fall 2010 grades is not available; current college students can submit transcripts from their spring or summer 2010 session if fall 2010 grades are unavailable.
- Transcripts <u>MUST</u> be official, come in an official envelope, and be sealed.
- You should place your request with your school early as they will need time to process requests.
- Your application will be considered incomplete if we do not receive official transcripts in an official and sealed envelope, and you will not be considered for our scholarships.

#### ❖ Personal Statement

- Your Personal Statement should be <u>no longer than</u> two pages, typed and double-spaced using 12-point type and one-inch margins.
- Do not submit additional pages as they will not be considered.
- Type the words "Personal Statement" at the top of each page, along with your first and last name.
- <u>Clearly</u> address the following three questions in sequential order, typing each question as it appears below. Type your response directly under each question.
  - 1. How will your course of study contribute to your future career plans, and why have you chosen this path?
  - 2. Tell us about a time you failed and what you learned from the experience.
  - 3. What personal possession do you cherish most and why?

#### SCHOLARSHIP SELECTION: Pages 11-21

It is <u>your responsibility</u> to ensure you qualify for each of the scholarships to which you apply. Take the time to carefully read the criteria for each scholarship and clearly check those boxes for each scholarship you are applying to.
