REPORT FROM PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE – (PNC)

The PNC has accomplished a major step in the process of moving toward the `call_ of our next senior pastor with the completion of the Church Information Form (CIF). Information contained in the CIF was compiled by interviews with all staff members, input from the congregation at Vision Day held in June, and many hours of study and discussion by the PNC.

An initial goal of the PNC was to complete the CIF by the end of June. Although it was an aggressive goal, the PNC was able to achieve it. Following completion by the PNC, the CIF requires approvals of Session of our church and the Committee on Ministry (COM) of Presbytery. Session held a special meeting on July 13th, reviewed the CIF and gave its stamp of approval. Following Session's action, the CIF was forwarded to Presbytery and approved by the COM on July 21st.

The CIF is posted on the denomination's website under Church Leadership Connection (CLC). The PNC plans to post the CIF on our own church's website and display a copy on the 'bulletin wall_ that has been established on the south wall of Fellowship Hall.

The PNC would like to thank everyone who contributed to the information contained in the CIF. Dialogue and input from the staff and congregation was vital to the process and will be important in defining the role of our new senior pastor.

Looking ahead, the PNC plans to advertise the pastor position in several national publications which are available to pastors across the country. It is anticipated the PNC will be receiving Personal Information Forms (PIF) by early fall from prospective candidates.

2008 FALL SMALL GROUP OPPORTUNITES

1. The Word - word by word!

A weekly informal Bible study for everyone, beginning with the book of Mark. Leader- Rev. Chuck Teague Sunday evenings 6:00-7:00 p.m. beginning September 7th at GPC.

In response to requests for a more in-depth Bible study, on September 7 we'll begin a weekly Sunday evening class. Our teacher will be the Rev. Dr. Charles Teague. A graduate of Gettysburg College and the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Chuck was a pastor for 24 years before returning to Gettysburg in 2003. His wife, Leah, is an elder in our church and they both sing in the worship choir.

We will start with the Gospel of Mark, which most scholars believe was the first Gospel written. Each Sunday night from 6:00 to 7:00 pm we will walk verse-by-verse through the text seeking understanding of the Biblical message. No pre-registration is necessary. Bring your favorite translation and we'll compare how the meaning of the text is expressed.

Chuck is also a former attorney and retired Lt. Colonel in the Air Force, having spent his last years as a Chaplain. He now volunteers as Chaplain of the Gettysburg Police and serves as a Park Ranger Historian at Gettysburg National Military Park.

2. The Truth Project

A 13 week DVD based study on the importance of living the Christian worldview in daily life. (Want to know more about The Truth Project? Visit www.thetruthproject.org) Leaders- Chooch and Becky Wells Tuesday evenings 6:45-9:00pm beginning October 7th. (Meeting place to be announced)

On Oct. 7, 2008, GPC will launch an in-depth study on how God is at work in every aspect of our lives. Chooch and I first heard about The Truth Project, from Focus on the Family, from our daughter Lori, who, with her husband Gary, attended training to lead this course over two years ago. Since that time, they have led two groups of senior high students and a group of over 60 adult members of their church through this study, with exciting results. They have planned and scheduled an all day simulcast leadership training event from the Focus on the Family organization in NJ on Sept. 27. Chooch and I, along with persons from many other churches, will be attending this training.

The Truth Project is a 13-week, two hour, DVD-based study in which deep transformation is the goal. The study focuses on the very nature of God and His perfect design. Dr. Del Tackett is the dynamic leader of this DVD series. We believe your life will be transformed as you study with us. There are flyers available in the church office and Fellowship Hall.
