THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

The Resurrection of Jesus was the first sign and the guarantee of the huge harvest that was to follow, the harvest of forgiveness and peace He brings, the harvest of His presence in so many human lives, and the harvest of mission as we try to share something of Christ with others.

The story of Easter was not finished with the Ascension of Jesus. Now we are a part of the Easter story. Jesus is counting on us to bring others to know Him as we witness our faith with others. God bless you.


Thank you!

One Faith One Hope One Love Questions and Answers

- Who? Every parish in the diocese will participate. We are in Block One at Incarnation.
- ♦ How Much? Our goal is the largest of any parish ... \$3.5 million.
- Where Do We Stand? Generous parishioners have already pledged \$ 1.75 M (50% of our goal.)
- What's The Money For?
 - 1) 50% goes to Catholic Education in the form of yearly \$1000 grants to qualifying families and funds will be provided for the PREP Programs in all parishes.
 - 2) 20% will be returned to Incarnation parish as pledges are received. If we reach our goal we will get back 60% of anything collected above the goal. This money will be used for capital improvements and tuition assistance.
 - 12% will go to foster vocations and for capital improvements needed due to increased enrollment at the seminary in Cincinnati.
 - 4) 10% will be used to provide for retired Diocesan Priests. In the next 5 yrs the number of retired priests is projected to increase from 84 to 140.
 - 5) 8% will go to Catholic Charities for the fund bank and other services.
- What's Needed for Success? We need your prayers. We need everyone to answer their phones or return calls when parish volunteers leave a message. If you have discontinued your landline or have changed your phone number, please call the parish office so we have up to date information.
- How Do I Contribute? One Faith One Hope One Love is a campaign designed for a 5 year pledge. You can make a one-time payment but are encouraged to consider a larger pledge.
- How Do I Pay? You can use credit card, checking account, check or debit, stock transfers or a donation as part of your will. Many employers offer a match so please check.
- s This Deductible? Yes. A separate foundation has been set up as a 501 (C) (3) Trust.
- How Long? If everyone cooperates by providing timely feedback we hope to be finished with the campaign by the end of May.

The Archbishop asks that you prayerfully consider the invitation being made. Incarnation has always been a generous parish and we are again being asked to give sacrificially for the good of the church.
