Membership and Foundation Forum

The Rotary District Membership and Foundation Forum was just held and offered over a dozen workshops. Rotarians participated in open discussions on how to run new member orientations and fireside chats, using public relations to promote your club in order to get new members, how to retain your current members, using awards

and rewards, what to do when a club is having problems, and how to sponsor a new club or grow a smaller one. That last topic was facilitated by Worcester Sunset club president, Cheryl Rosen. The foundation portion of the day included data

on how much our district annual giving has been over the last three years. Our district has raised \$34,000 in the last 20 months for PolioPlus. Since

1997, our district has produced \$4 million worth of humanitarian grant projects. Many current club projects were highlighted. A presentation was made on how to invest your money in Rotary, using the Benefactor's and Bequest programs. Also discussed was the Ambassadorial Scholar program and the Group Study Exchange program. Three members of our team to the Philippines were present.

Member sponsor and retention recognition

At its January meeting, the RI Board adopted a New Member Sponsor and Retention Recognition program, which became effective 1 July. The program, also part of the long-term membership strategy, allows Rotary club presidents to nominate and recognize individuals for sponsoring new members while focusing on retention. There are several award categories:

Gold pin and certificate: For Rotarians bringing 25 members into any Rotary club, with 20 still active after six years

Silver pin and certificate: For Rotarians bringing 10 members into any Rotary club, with eight still active after four years

Bronze pin and certificate: For Rotarians bringing five members into any Rotary club, with four still active after two years
