Please note that these are brief descriptions of the ethnically based scholarships being offered through the PSU Foundation. **Each scholarship has unique criteria, qualifications, and award amounts found on the individual applications in this packet. Daniel & Laura Brose Memorial Scholarship

Graduate

The Daniel & Laura Brose Memorial Scholarship was created in December 2001 by Albert and Margaret Chen, Telamon Corporation, in recognition of the support given to them by the Daniel and Laura Brose family. The scholarship will benefit graduate students who are enrolled in, or admitted to, a graduate program within the Portland State University Fariborz Maseeh Department of Mathematics and Statistics. Award recipients will be selected for their academic achievements and potential. Priority will be given to students of Asian descent. One or more scholarships will be awarded for 2012/2013. Renewal will require a formal application and will go through the same review as all other applications for the scholarship. Recipients will be selected on the basis of academic achievement and financial need.

Culturally Responsive Mathematics Education Scholarship

Graduate

The Culturally Responsive Mathematics Education Scholarship was created to support a future teacher from an ethnic minority who is committed and qualified to teach mathematics in a culturally responsive manner in a high needs school. The donors are interested in increasing diversity in the teaching profession and the applicant's commitment and ability to work with a diverse population in mathematics education. The scholarship will benefit an ethnic minority graduate student with a meritorious academic record and financial need who has been admitted into the Graduate Teacher Education Program in the Graduate School of Education preparing for an initial teaching license in mathematics and a career in teaching mathematics. One scholarship will be awarded for the 2012/2013 academic year.

Faaleava-Whitefoot Pacific Islander Club Student Scholarship

Undergraduate

The Faaleava-Whitefoot Pacific Islander Club Student Scholarship was created by the Pacific Islander Club of Portland State University to recognize the contributions that students of Pacific Island descent make to the educational, cultural, and social life of the campus. Applicants will explain what their Pacific Island culture means to them, why they are pursuing a degree in higher education, and how they will contribute to the Pacific Islander Club. One or more scholarships for educational expenses will be made annually. The award is not automatically renewed, but a recipient may apply in subsequent years.

Kaibigan: Filipino American Student Association Scholarship

Undergraduate

KAIBIGAN is the Filipino American Student Association at Portland State University whose purpose is to unite and empower Filipino American students at Portland State University through educational, cultural, political, and social activities, while celebrating the Filipino American experience. The PSU Kaibigan Scholarship was created to support Filipino/Filipino American students at Portland State University. Recipients will be required to carry a minimum of 12 credit hours per term, be a part of Kaibigan, and join a minimum of one Kaibigan Committee. One or more scholarships will be awarded for 2012/2013. Students may re-apply for this scholarship one time (maximum of two annual awards per student during their tenure at Portland State). Dolores and Fernando Leon Family Scholarship**Undergraduate**

The Dolores and Fernando Leon Family Scholarship was established to provide financial assistance to students of Hispanic or Latino heritage, especially those who are Mexican or Mexican American, who are pursuing a course of study leading to a health care career, and who are in need of financial assistance. Recipients will be required to carry a minimum of 12 credit hours per term and maintain a GPA of 3.0. Scholars may qualify for renewal as long as they maintain this level of course work, have a good academic record, and are otherwise successfully progressing towards their degree. Recipients will be selected on the basis of academic achievement and financial need.

McCoy Graduate Scholarship**Graduate**

The McCoy Graduate Scholarship will be awarded to an ethnic minority graduate social work student from Oregon or Southwest Washington. The scholarship honors State Senator William McCoy and Multnomah County Commission Chair, Gladys McCoy, two of Portland's most dedicated public servants. The McCoy's were committed to addressing the needs of vulnerable populations, including the poor, children, women and members of diverse cultures. A recipient will be selected on the basis of academic achievement and financial need. One or more scholarships will be awarded for 2012/2013.

Kayo Uchida Sato Memorial Scholarship**Undergraduate**

The Kayo Uchida Sato Memorial Scholarship was established in an effort to affirmatively increase the number of ethnic minority students entering the fields of math and the natural sciences. Awards for 2012/2013 will be given to one or more Portland State University undergraduate students (new freshmen and continuing students at all levels). The scholarship honors Kayo Uchida Sato, who had a strong commitment to educational opportunity and attainment. Recipients will be selected on the basis of academic achievement and financial need.

School of Social Work Staff & Faculty Scholarship for Students of Color **Undergraduate & Graduate**

The School of Social Work is committed to increasing and retaining ethnic and racial diversity within the School's student population and wants this scholarship to serve as one specific way it can support students of color. The School of Social Work Staff & Faculty Scholarship for Students of Color will be awarded to an admitted School of Social Work student who has financial need. This scholarship is open to both undergraduate and graduate students.

Schwenn Family Scholarship**Undergraduate**

Renewal Only for 2012/13 (renewal applications will be provided to current recipients)

The Schwenn Family Scholarship Fund provides scholarships to first-time freshmen and transferring or continuing students at Portland State University who have a strong desire and determination to attain a college degree, but may not have the financial resources to do so. Preference in awards may be given to students who are first time freshmen and minorities, but awards are not limited to freshmen or minorities who meet the requirements. Awards will be based on the undergraduate, resident, full-time student budget. The scholarships may be renewed annually for a maximum of four years if the student completes at least 36 credit hours during the academic year, maintains a good academic record, and is otherwise successfully progressing toward his/her baccalaureate degree. Recipients will be selected on the basis of academic achievement and financial need.

State Treasurer's Urban Pioneer Scholarship**Undergraduate & Graduate**

The State Treasurer's Urban Pioneer Scholarship was created to support ethnic minority undergraduate and graduate students who are successfully working toward a degree in PSU's College of Urban and Public Affairs. Awards will be based on financial need and academic merit. Awards will be based on the undergraduate, resident, full-time student budget. One or more scholarships will be awarded for the 2012/2013 academic year.

The scholarship will benefit an ethnic minority graduate student with a meritorious academic record and financial need who has been admitted into the Graduate Teacher Education Program in the Graduate School of Education preparing for an initial teaching license in mathematics and a career in teaching mathematics.

One scholarship ranging from \$500 to \$1,000 will be awarded for the 2012/2013 academic year.

Dolores and Fernando Leon Family Scholarship

The Dolores and Fernando Leon Family Scholarship was established to provide financial assistance to students of Hispanic or Latino heritage, especially those who are Mexican or Mexican American, who are pursuing a course of study leading to a health care career, and who are in need of financial assistance. Leon Scholars will be eligible for an award of \$2,400 per year. Recipients will be required to carry a minimum of 12 credit hours per term and maintain a GPA of 3.0. Scholars may qualify for renewal as long as they maintain this level of course work, have a good academic record, and are otherwise successfully progressing towards their degree.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Applicants must have achieved at least junior status by Fall Term 2012 or be enrolled in the pre-nursing program with at least sophomore status at PSU.
- The student must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 in previous higher education course work and be making satisfactory progress toward his/her degree.
- The student must have demonstrated interest in pursuing a health-care career and possess attributes, proficiencies and a track record to be a competitive applicant for the academic path required by his/her chosen career.
- The student must provide two letters of support, with at least one from a current or past instructor in the sciences.
- The student must have financial need, as determined by the Financial Aid award or other statement of financial need*

(Background on Kayo Uchida Sato follows.)

KAYO UCHIDA SATO

1896 – 1984

Kayo Uchida Sato was born on September 23, 1896, in Okayamaken, Tsukubogun, Yamaji, Japan. She was the eldest of five children.

Kayo arrived in Seattle, Washington in 1915 as the pre-arranged picture bride of her first cousin, Benzo Sato. They were married in Seattle. Because of the language barrier they worked as seasonal laborers in Washington and Oregon, and later as a husband and wife team in the kitchen and dining hall of the Standard Box and Lumber Company's mill and logging camp in Scofield, Oregon. Kayo's two eldest daughters, Aiko and Masako, were born at this camp.

Around 1920, the Satos settled on a small farm in Hillsdale, Oregon to provide permanency for their children. In 1924, with two more daughters and expecting her fifth child, Kayo made a trip to Japan to be at the bedside of her dying father. It was a sad trip for Kayo, as both her father and two eldest daughters passed away. She returned to Portland after her first son was born. As the years passed, she was blessed with three more daughters and five sons.

In 1935, she and her family moved to another small farm near the Raleigh community. Because of the Asian background of the family, they were not permitted to become American citizens and were prohibited from purchasing property. After one more move to another small farm near Beaverton, the family was uprooted in May 1942, at which time they were transported to the Minidoka Relocation Center. Kayo and her family were to be interned in this camp until October 1945, after which they returned to Portland. The family moved into a war time public housing complex for shipyard workers constructed below a canal. On Memorial Day of 1948, the earthen dike of the canal gave way, flooding the city of Vanport. They managed to escape, but lost all their possessions except for a few clothes. After living in another public housing project for two years, they moved in 1950 to a house purchased by one of Kayo's sons. During this period, five of her sons entered the United States Military Service.

In May 1953, Kayo, her husband Benzo and their two youngest sons traveled to Japan for a reunion with relatives. While in Japan, Kayo realized that her thinking and attitudes had changed and she could no longer fit into Japanese culture. Her eleven surviving children living in the United States cemented her decision to return to America.

With the passing of her husband in March 1954, and the dispersal of her grown children, Kayo moved to the Senior Citizen's International Terrace Apartments in Seattle to be near her youngest son. She lived there happily and independently until the age of 87, at which time she moved to Ann Arbor, Michigan to live with one of her daughters. There, at the age of 88 years and 2 months, she quietly passed away.

As public schools were not available during her childhood, Kayo received her formal education from her village temple priest. The priest provided an intensive and extensive education for Kayo, and Kayo, in return, became an excellent student. She regretted leaving her schooling for she realized the future belonged to the educated. In her spare time, she read stories to her children by a kerosene lamp. She also taught them reading, writing and arithmetic before they entered school. Kayo also encouraged higher education for her children, but emphasized that each child would have to finance his or her own way. When Kayo's grandchildren visited her, she would lecture them on the importance of education, stressing the need for graduate studies as she felt, in these changing times, advanced degrees were necessary.

Kayo Sato never forgot her humble upbringing. She had sympathy and tolerance for the poor of all nations, especially minorities and Asian peoples. As she used to say, "The poor have only one way to go and that is up...given the opportunity."
