



He is professor emeritus of psychology and psychiatry at the University of California, Irvine, where he spent most of his career as a teacher, supervising psychologist, mentor, and director of ethnic studies and cross-cultural programs.

DR. SHAUN HARPER

Dr. Harper, assistant professor of higher education management at The University of Pennsylvania, maintains an active research agenda that examines race and gender in higher education; African American male achievement: the effects of college environments on student behaviors; and gains associated with educationally purposeful student engagement. In September 2007, Harper was featured on the cover of Diverse Issues in Higher Education for his National Black Male College Achievement Study, the largest ever empirical research project on black male undergraduates.
