DTSC – Boeing SSFL Quarterly Meeting March 14, 2001

The 1st Quarter 2001 DTSC and Boeing SSFL meeting was held on March 14, 2001 at the DTSC Glendale office from 11:00 to 4:00 PM. A list of attendees and agenda are attached. The agenda was generally followed. The issues listed below were discussed. Items in bold type require action.

<u>RCRA Facility Investigation Status</u>

Boeing provided an overview of the RFI progress. Data needs were discussed and commitments agreed upon in order to facilitate the final phases of RFI data review. Boeing will update the RFI schedule and present it to DTSC for concurrence. In addition, Boeing will update site figures with current RFI data and have them available for DTSC review.

<u>SSFL Building Review</u>

The scope of the SSFL Building review was discussed. DTSC and Boeing discussed DTSC's interest in the SSFL Radiological program. Rick Moss and Steve Lafflam to continue discussion at a later date. DTSC will develop evaluation criteria and flowcharts for further discussion of the SSFL building review.

Hazardous Materials Laboratory (HML)/Columbia Analytical Services (CAS)

Boeing provided an update of the ongoing CAS review. HML will perform independent validation of CAS data following the completion of the evaluation.

<u>FSDF Update</u>

As of March 14, 2001 approximately 11,275 tons of FSDF soil have been disposed of at the Buttonwillow Class I hazardous waste landfill.

• Public Participation Plan (PPP)

DTSC is scheduled to submit a questionnaire to approximately 25,000 residences proximal to the SSFL. The questionnaire will be used to update the PPP. In addition, DTSC provided Boeing a "Draft Outline of the SSFL Community Involvement Plan Update".

Groundwater Investigation Update

Both the Shallow and Chatsworth Formation groundwater investigations are ongoing. To date, 95 new piezometers have been installed.

<u>Groundwater Treatment System Permit Modifications</u>

The mandatory 60-day public notice for the Permit Modifications started on February 22, 2001 and a public meeting was scheduled for March 22, 2001.

• Sampling and Analysis Plan (SAP) Permit Modifications

DTSC and Boeing were scheduled to meet on March 27, 2001 to discuss the monitoring well network in the proposed permit modification. Boeing will provide data/information to DTSC for review prior to the meeting. DTSC will provide Boeing a SAP from another facility to serve as an example for the SSFL permit modifications.

<u>NPDES/RCRA Permitting</u>

Boeing provided DTSC with regulatory background for RCRA Permit exemptions and conversion to Permit by Rule for the Groundwater Remediation Facilities. **DTSC to review and discuss with Boeing.**

<u>Regional Water Quality Control Board Issues (RWQCB)</u>

Boeing informed DTSC of a RWQCB letter submitted to USEPA that identified several surface water NPDES permit excursions for mercury during 2000. The majority of the excursions were related to FSDF prior to the implementation of interim measures. In addition, surface water excursions occurred at the SRE facility NPDES outfall. The SRE, a RCRA Corrective Action Area of Concern, will be evaluated for soil clean up actions to prevent future excursions.
