HEALTH CONT.

Did You Know....?

- More than two thirds of your body weight is water!
- During physical activity you sweat to keep your body cool and working well. During one hour of physical activity, your body can lose as much as one quart of water, depending on how hot it is and how intense your activity is.
- Being thirsty is your body's way of telling you that you are on the road to dehydration. Dehydration means that your body does not have the amount of water and fluids that it needs. Don't wait until you are thirsty to drink fluids.
- During hot weather you should drink plenty of water every day. The general recommendation is to drink six to eight glasses of water or other beverages a day. Avoid alcoholic beverages in the heat, as they can increase dehydration. If you are on a fluid-restricted diet be sure to talk with doctor about the daily amount of fluids that are right for you.
- Eating fruits and vegetables that are 85% - 95% water, such as strawberries, raspberries, oranges, melons, celery, tomatoes, cucumbers, broccoli, cabbage and carrots, also help you stay hydrated.
- Drink water before, during and after outdoor physical activity in the hot weather. Drink two cups of water before activity, more water during physical activity, and another cup of water afterward.
- On hot spring and summer days, do your outdoor physical activity during the early part of the day or in the evening when temperatures are cooler.
- Wear light-colored, light-weight and loose-fitting clothes. This will also help keep you cool in the summer heat.

Did you know that a Quinceañera/Sweet 16 is a communal celebration and public commitment that a young person HAS been living the faith and will continue living their Catholic Faith? If you are interested in celebrating your Quincenera/Sweet 16 with a Mass of Thanksgiving, please give us 2 years advance notice to help us plan your celebration.

- The Honoree's parents must be registered PARTICIPATING members of Holy Family Church at the time of registration.
- The Honoree must be enrolled in Religious Education and participating in the Youth Ministry 2 years prior to the year of their celebration.
- The Honoree must be baptized and have received the Sacrament of Eucharist. If she does not have the Sacrament of Confirmation, she must be working towards receiving that sacrament.

Legacy of Faith ~ Future of Hope Our Plan

Our Parish began the "Pave the Way" campaign to raise funds for parking lot improvements a few years ago. There are still necessary improvements needed to complete the funding for this project.

We now have an excellent opportunity to raise funds for our parish because we are joining our efforts with our Diocese in a historic capital campaign called Legacy of Faith ~ Future of Hope. This campaign is the first of its kind in the diocese, and will enable our Diocese and Holy Family Parish to raise significant funds for our needs. Our minimum need is \$490,000 over five years. Holy Family Parish will receive \$98,000 of these funds. Additionally, 80% of every dollar we raise over our diocesan goal will be returned to our parish., so we've set for ourselves a parish goal of \$510,000 above the diocesan minimum of \$490,000, for a total of \$1,000,000.

With our share of funds we will receive will be used towards:

- 1) Parking Lot improvements (see proposed layout)
- 2) Church improvements (including new pews, new kneelers and other improvements)
- 3) Chapel improvements
- 4) New sound system for the parish

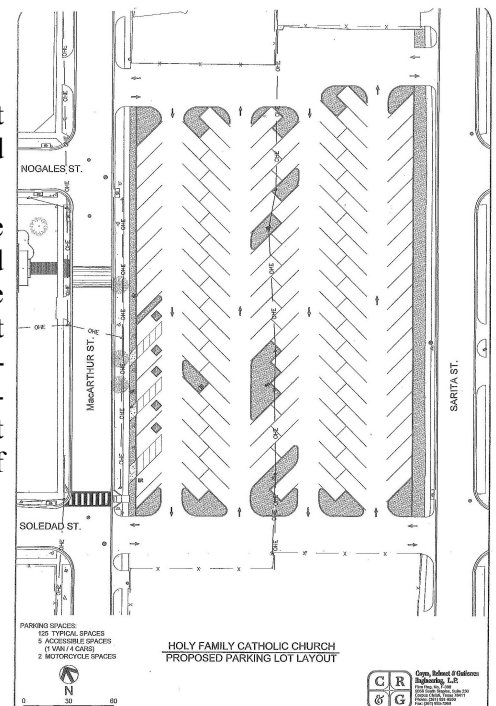
