**HC DrugFree** in coordination with the Wilde Lake High School PTSA, is hosting the debut of a new program on **April 27th, 2010 from 7PM - 8:30 PM in the James Rouse Theater** (located at Wilde Lake High School). "HAZE" - *the Perils of the College Drinking Culture in America* profiles a true and tragic story of Gordie, an 18 year old College freshman.

"HAZE" - The Perils of the College Drinkina Culture in America Program Description: On Sept 16, 2004 Gordie, an 18 year old freshman at the University of Colorado, pledged a fraternity. The next morning, he was found dead - a victim of an irresponsible hazing ritual involving alcohol. ## NEIGHBORHOOD SAFETY NEWS!!!

The **Make Route 32 Safe** committee, which has been working since last summer for safety improvements to MD 32 from Route 70 north to the county line, is trying to make sure that other members of our community know about a proposal before the Howard County Zoning Board to rezone property at the intersection of Livestock Road and MD 32 to allow a Highs gas station and convenience store.

The original rezoning request by Highs was denied by the county because of traffic safety concerns at the intersection. Highs has made a few revisions to their proposal, but the Make Route 32 Safe committee has serious objections to an increase in cross traffic activity in an already dangerous area.

We are trying to make sure that members of the Marriotts Ridge community are aware of the zoning hearings, as they have not been well publicized. The next hearing is

scheduled for **Wednesday, March 10 at 7 pm** at the county offices in Columbia behind Apple Ford. (8930 Stanford Blvd, 21045)

The safety committee would greatly appreciate any input and your attendance by Marriotts Ridge High School families meeting. at this We encourage our neighbors to take a look at the website for more information. I believe there is a link to a Facebook page with the same info, too.

The safety committee is objecting to the proposed Highs based on traffic safety issues on MD 32. There will likely be other members of the community who support or object for other reasons. Anyone who plans to speak should make sure that they sign in when they enter the hearing room.

What is Driver Education?

Thirty (30) hours of classroom instruction: There will be 10 sessions, each session will be 3 hours and 15 minutes long with a 15-minute break between each 1-1/2 hour. Classes run Monday through Friday for two weeks (excluding holidays). Six (6) hours of in-car training. There will be three sessions lasting two hours per session. Driving times are made by appointment and may fall on any day of the week at any time. Remember NO permit is needed to start the course. Any Maryland resident over the age of 15 interested in obtaining a drivers license must take this class.
