AIR TRAINING CORP- EASTER CAMP

Four cadets and two members of staff from 2519 (Strathmore) Squadron, Air Training Corps, had a successful week's camp, from the 31st of March to the 7th of April with 20 other cadets and six staff drawn from 1145 (Dunfermline), 571 (Cupar), 1192 (Kirkcaldy), 2435 (St. Andrews), 2284 (City of Dunblane), 2311 (Glenrothes), 1370 (Leven), 775 (Burntisland), and 859 (Dalgety Bay) Squadrons, at Royal Air Force Linton-on-Ouse, Yorkshire.

The four cadets who attended from 2519 (Strathmore) Squadron were Cadets Ashton Dobie, Rea Bloice, Aidan Preston and George Simpson and the staff members were Flight Lieutenants Roy Kemp and Michael Kay, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve (Training), the above photograph was taken in front of the gate guardian, a Tucano T1.

The cadets arrived at R.A. F. Linton-on-Ouse on Saturday the 31st March in the afternoon and after being allocated their accommodation and flights the cadets were given a security brief from a member of the Police Flight, followed by a health and safety brief by a member of the Fire Section, and were also introduced to all the camp staff members. After their evening meal the cadets carried out a familiarisation exercise in their flights to learn their way round the station. On Sunday the cadets started their camp with a visit to Eden Camp, the only modern history theme museum of its type in the World which covers six acres. Sixteen cadets went flying at RAF Church Fenton in the Grob Tutor T1 of 9AEF (Air Experience Flight), three cadets from 2519 (Strathmore) Squadron flew with 9AEF - they were cadets Rea Bloice, Aidan Preston and George Simpson. Four cadets were lucky to be allocated a flight with VGS 642 (Volunteer Gliding Squadron) gliding in Vigilant which is a self propelled glider that is based at RAF Linton-on-Ouse.

During the rest of the week the cadets had many section visits to the Squadrons and Units which are based at Royal Air Force Linton-on-Ouse, such as the Fire Section, Survival Equipment Section, 72 Squadron which fly the Tucano, the Royal Air Force's fast jet trainer, Air Traffic Control. They also undertook training for the Mk 8 .22 rifle or the 5.65. mm Cadet L 98 rifle and firing of the rifles on the barrack range during their camp. They all undertook Leadership Exercises at Adrenalin, North Yorkshire in a wooded area where they carried out exercises on two of the high ropes areas followed by all the cadets undertaking the assault course which was used for the Krypton Factor a number of years ago, which they all enjoyed.

They also had an afternoon at Elvington Air Museum where they saw many of the aircraft that the Royal Air Force flew in the past, and also a visit to the National Railway Museum in York followed by them all exploring York such as York Minster, the Shambles and some of the shops.

On Friday evening the cadets started their packing ready for returning home before the presentation of various prizes and awards gained during the week, followed by a fun night.

The cadets returned home on Saturday 7th April all tired, but having had a very enjoyable week and having made new friends from other squadrons.

- VOICE TEASER -

What is the origin of MILLHAUGH?

Answer to April's Teaser— **Manitoba by Bardmony** The 21/2 acre field (O.S. 1525) which goes with Bardmony Smithy, and lies between the old and new roads north of Bardmony Farm. It was the last part of the neighbouring moor to be brought under cultivation, and no doubt the new lands of Manitoba were baing talked of at the time.

[Extract from Meikle's 'Places and Place-Names Round Alyth' 1925]



A clue for the explanation of the name McRitch is to be found on Stobie's map of Perthshire, published in 1783. There, the name is given as 'Macheriech' which looks to me like 'Machair riabhaich' in modern Gaelic. 'Machair' means 'plain'. Its present day use is preserved in the 'machairs' of the Uists. 'Magh' is another word for plain, as found in Magherafelt (the Plain of Fíolta, Fíolta being personal name, I should guess) in Northern Ireland. The word 'riabhaich' means brindled, possibly referring to a damp meadow with grasses, sedges and rushes and a host of flowers.

ALYTH THISTLE early 1900s





PLANTATION

The felling of the Whitehills plantation here at Bamff provokes many thoughts, among which the first might be regret at the loss of the wood as habitat for red squirrels. I keep thinking about this and hoping that there is scope for other plantations here to receive the displaced squirrels. Change in the landscape might be another; though for some the new light rich scene is welcome, as it is for Nick and Aileen in the lodge. For Jim Duncan, who helped plant the wood in the nineteen fifties there is the dimension of memory: his memories include those of the people he knew who took part in the planting and those who lived and worked at Bamff in those days. I can only think of a few: old John White, the estate overseer, his son Jack (who lives in Kettins). Then there must have been Jim's father, Will, and others such as John Ferguson, the gamekeeper. My great-uncle, Sir Douglas Ramsay, must have been present on occasion, as also his son, Neis, who succeeded him. I wonder if John McEwan, the well-known forester and radical land reformer, visited the planting to see how things were going? It may have been before his time.

John Ferguson was an Islay man who had served in the river police in Glasgow, but had been obliged to leave the Force after he threw some miscreant into the water. John was a famous breeder of gun dogs and had a great hatred for the Craighall gamekeeper, Geordie Sinclair, from Caithness originally, and also a retired policeman from Glasgow, though I don't think Geordie threw anyone in the river. Either way we knew about the Ferguson/Sinclair enmity because it manifested itself, mostly as barbed jibes, on the occasions when we shot over the old Drimmie commonty.

Soon after the planting of the Whitehills wood there was trouble with browsing by roe deer and John White suggested to my great-uncle that he put up some netting to keep the deer out. Sir Douglas's rejoinder was that he employed a gamekeeper and it was up to him to ensure that the young plantation was a success. Spurred on by this, John ensured that the young trees survived the browsing and fraying of the roe deer and grew to produce good timber. I often think about Uncle Douglas's strong line on the management of deer. We hear too often that deer should be fenced out of plantations when, in reality their numbers should be more rigorously controlled.

John Ferguson was hard on poachers. Jim Duncan once told me that a favorite ploy of his was to drive his car down to Alyth and leave it parked in the square. Then, he would return to Bamff. The poachers, seeing his car in the square, would assume that he was in the Commercial Hotel and make their way to Bamff, where he would ambush them. So much for memory: all those I have mentioned, except Jim himself and Jack White are gone, leaving only memories to those who knew and cared for them.

... the plantation has been turned to timber and lorry loads are making their way to various places: to a sawmill in Haddington for the green log and other places, whose names I cannot remember, for the pallet and chip wood. Some loads were driven to Montrose to make up a load of timber that was to be shipped abroad for pulping.

This takes me on to another thought, which is that the Whitehills wood was always meant to be a commercial wood, a wood whose production would be turned into timber and so into cash, some of which would be used to replant the ground. I accept that (of course I do - I need the money after all), though with the misgivings I have mentioned: loss of habitat for red squirrels and other inhabitants of coniferous woodland (even if temporary), change of landscape and the memories that go with it.

In next month's article I am going to write about the prospect of replanting the Whitehills Wood.
