From the Pastor—

So ends another Church Year...with a call for renewed loyalty and allegiance to Christ our King. The Fifth Grade (both public and parochial students) joyfully receive their First Communion, our congregation welcomes twenty-some new members...and the Gospel is preached, the faithful are both encouraged and consoled, and God is glorified in the lives of the saints at Messiah.

With the coming of Advent, we begin again. As usual, we find ourselves in one of the (if not THE) busiest seasons of all. There is much to do as we prepare for Christmas Day. The preparatory time seems to get more and more front-loaded--I saw a neighborhood watering hole with garlands already strung across its façade and the "holiday"-themed ads have begun to appear.

The Church originally began its observance of Advent as a kind of mirror to the Lenten preparatory period before Easter. There is no doubt that, spiritually and psychologically, a time of waiting, preparation, and anticipation increases the 'payoff' for most things, even though our present cultural attitudes favor more immediate gratification. Some would even say that Lent and Advent provide a 'training' time that helps us consider all the things we might wish to concentrate on without letting the world outside the faith set the agenda.

Advent has weathered times of neglect in the past, but among some traditionally non-liturgical folks it's becoming more and more important. As they discover it (and good for them!) we might reinvest ourselves in this very Lutheran practice. So let's break out the Advent Calendars, Hymns, and maybe even wear a little blue to remind ourselves that in the midst of the December madness, the

Church offers a respite—Saturday evening/Sunday morning and Wednesday evenings—as times for Advent celebration, meditation, and quiet joy as we worship the Coming King, Christ the Lord.

Wednesday Evening Advent services begin at 7:00 pm. A reflective service of Evening Prayer (in which the preaching will focus on the theme of "Living in Anticipation") will contain a wealth of Advent tunes. These services can be a welcome oasis in the midst of weeks filled to overflowing with work, school, shopping, errands, and the like. Join fellow saints in this opportunity to joyously anticipate Christ's advent—as the Child of Bethlehem, as our gracious Lord and Savior in the present, and as the promised Bridegroom for the Wedding Feast of the Lamb.

Advent Worship Survey Your Responses, Please!

Worship—gathering together in the name of Christ for the gifts God gives in his Word and Sacraments—is the foundation of the Church's life. As we begin a new year in the life of the Church, Messiah's pastors and lay leaders are looking for feedback about the experience of worship at Messiah. What are we doing well? Helen Casselberry Interview

Marketing Team member Jenna Peyton sat down with Messiah Principal, Helen Casselberry to learn about her background, interests, and vision for Messiah School. Below is an excerpt from the interview:

When asked to identify challenges facing Messiah, Mrs. Casselberry notes that Messiah is ready to grow and she acknowledges the terrific families that make up the school. She would like Messiah to earn its Blue Ribbon

accreditation, which is a national program that recognizes consistent academic leadership and teaching practices. This will require some changes to our curriculum, most notably, implementation of a foreign language instruction. The process will not be quick, but Mrs. Casselberry will be at the helm for the process.

Why Messiah? Why Lutheran education? Mrs. Casselberry, who as a child attended United Methodist churches, examined more of the Lutheran theology while at St. Olaf and decided that the Lutheran denomination is where she is most comfortable theologically. In support of Lutheran education, Mrs. Casselberry notes that as Lutherans, we have the opportunity to balance celebration and preparation. We celebrate the gifts God gave us in our children and their talents by developing those talents to the fullest, and we help our children prepare to use those gifts to serve. 4th and 5th Graders Reenact Slaves On Underground Railroad

The FFA Camp Muskingum: Nature's Classroom Living History provided our students with first-hand experience traveling the Underground Railroad near New Philadelphia, Ohio. Led by "conductors", we marched, hid, and ran up and down the Appalachian foothills in our quest for freedom from slavery and a new life across the Ohio River. Life on the run was dangerous; we were captured by bounty hunters, sold to secret abolitionists and hidden in shelters, cellars, and ditches. Our students became slaves on the run in disguise as a traveling choir (singing a few songs to prove our charade!). After three hours on the run, we made it safely to the Ohio border! All of the students were relieved to be free to settle down, and happy for this experience. Living this historical event, even briefly, brought much for the students to reflect, write and discuss at home and school.

"Notes" From the Director of Music

It would be tempting to re-run last month's article, simply to see if a second time around might engender more of a dialogue regarding

the state and direction of music for worship in today's churches. However, I'll spare you the rerun in light of a brief mention of the forthcoming season in the church year. For those of us with a wide range of choices in service music, that is, preludes, postludes, offerings, anthems, hymns and settings of the liturgy, the Three Seasons - Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany - comprise an incredibly rich and contrasting section of the Church Year. While Christmas Eve gets the nod as the biggie of the events, we need to address the preparation for the birth of Jesus with even greater care than Christmas Eve...Christmas Eve almost takes care of itself! Likewise the season of Epiphany can be seen either as a bit of a letdown following Christmas, or a magnificent crescendo leading to Lent and Easter. As I wrote in the conclusion of last month's article,

cated outside of the school office. If you prefer, you may send cash or a check to "Messiah School" and we will take care of the shopping. We also need volunteers for the event.



From Our Parish Nurse

Do you know where the salt or sodium comes from in our diets? 5% is added during cooking, 6% is added while eating, 12% occurs naturally in our food, and 77% PARISH comes from prepared and processed Murse foods. A healthy diet usually con-

tains enough sodium without adding extra. In ancient times, salt was a valuable commodity.

It is also referred to in the Bible. Since the earliest of times it was used to season and preserve food. Salt preserves food by preventing the survival or reproduction of many bacteria and fungi. Believe it or not salt served as money in some cultures and it was highly valued. The word 'salary' was derived from the word salt.

Healthy Americans should try to limit their sodium to no more that 2,300 mg per day. Although salt is an essential nutrient, most people consume more than they need. Just one teaspoon of salt has about 2,325mg of sodium in it. Too much sodium may lead to high blood pressure, a risk factor for heart disease and stroke. Salt can cause your body to retain extra fluid which it does not need.

When buying canned and preserved food, you need to check the label to see how much sodium is in a serving. Don't be shocked if you find certain foods contain very large amounts of sodium. You may even find that one serving contains almost ½ of your daily requirement of sodium. These are foods that should be avoided or look for a different brand which contains less sodium.

The Story of the Candy Cane

It was invented by a Christian in England in the 17th century. At that time the government would not let people celebrate So a candy maker made Christmas. candy shaped like a crook to be a secret symbol of Jesus. The three small stripes represent the Holy Spirit. The large red stripe is for the life of Jesus, that he gave up for us. The candy was a double gift, a sweet treat and a symbol of Christmas. As you may have already heard from your IRA administrators, Congress has re-authorized legislation that allows you or a family member to make charitable gifts from your IRA accounts during 2011 without incurring income tax on the withdrawal. To take advantage of this you must act by December 31, 2011. Contact your IRA administrator for details.


Scrap Metal Recycling Fund Raising Project at Messiah Off to a Great Start:
