

UNIVERSITY AT BUFFALO ADVANCED COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAM **Application Material**

The University at Buffalo offers academically talented high school students an opportunity to complete college courses for full credit while completing their remaining high school requirements. For qualified students, the Advanced College Credit Program (ACCP) offers enrollment throughout the academic year in day and evening courses and in each of the summer sessions. ACCP students attend regular university classes requiring a high level of preparation in high school coursework. Typically, accepted ACCP students enroll in freshman-level courses. Students benefit from a wide array of entry-level courses in the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS).

The Advanced College Credit Program is not intended to replace or take precedence over requirements or offerings available at the secondary level. Enrollment is limited to one or two courses per semester, and course selection is carefully monitored by the program advisor. Please note that admission to the program does not assure admission to the University at Buffalo after high school graduation. Grades received from the University at Buffalo are transferable to both public and private colleges and universities.

Admission and advisement are provided jointly by the Office of Admissions and the College of Arts and Sciences. Application materials may be obtained from either office. Instructions concerning advisement services and registration procedures will be made available upon admission to the program. Questions concerning advisement and course selection should be referred to Brian Waldrop, CAS Student Advising Services. Completed applications, including all supporting documents, should be mailed from the high school counseling office directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions by the recommended deadlines.

Admission and Application Instructions

To be considered for admission to the Advanced College Credit Program, applicants must:

- 1. Demonstrate superior achievement in high school: a competitive high school average, strong performance on standardized tests (PSAT, SAT or ACT) and competence in relevant courses.
- 2. Possess sufficient maturity to benefit from a college experience. In general, accepted applicants will have completed the junior year. Exceptions are considered on an individual basis.
- 3. Receive endorsement from the high school counselor or teacher.
- 4. Submit a completed application, along with supporting documentation:
 - a) high school transcript, including standardized test scores.
 - b) counselor recommendation (use attached form).
 - c) personal statement (use attached form).

The applicant should complete sections A and B of the application and submit it to the high school counselor. The counselor should complete the recommendation form (section C), enclose the transcript and test scores, and mail the entire packet to the Office of Admissions at the address below.

Recommended filing dates (return applications as soon as possible, but no later than):

- December 1 (for spring or winter admission)
- May 1 (fall Admission)
- 4 weeks prior to start of any summer session
