

- Discuss the role of the consultant pharmacist as part of the interdisciplinary team in the care of nursing home residents.
- · Review pharmacy regulations included in the state operations manual.
- · Discuss important current issues relating to long term care.
- · Identify and evaluate patient use of OTC products.
- · Evaluate OTC use in the institutional setting.
- · Outline medical conditions that must be differentiated from anxiety in the elderly.
- Determine the prevalence of each of the anxiety disorders in the elderly.
- · Compare and contrast pharmacological causes for delirium.
- Recommend steps pharmacists can take in the management of delirium in geriatric patients.
- · Describe available guidelines of the management of Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA).
- · Identify areas of clinical controversy in the treatment of Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA).
- · Identify pain assessments appropriate for use in patients with dementia.
- Review federal guidelines for pain/discomfort assessment and monitoring in the long term care setting.
- · Describe the evaluation and diagnosis of resistant hypertension in various patient populations.
- Identify treatment options in the management of resistant hypertension in various populations.
- · Describe indications and recommendations for use of new anticoagulant therapy.
- Discuss use of new anticoagulant drugs in special populations.
- · Discuss new chemical entities approved by the FDA in 2011.
- Identify new drugs approved by the FDA in 2011 that represent a major therapeutic advance.
- · Recommend ways to detect literacy limitations.
- · Describe the 'teach-back' method of detecting limitations.
- Interpret the ACIP vaccination charts.
- · Identify required vaccinations for adolescents.
- · Recognize signs and symptoms of PCOS.
- · Recommend appropriate therapies to induce ovulation in women with PCOS experiencing infertility.
- · Identify the most common causes of hyperglycemic crises.
- · Develop a treatment plan for patients with hyperglycemic crises.
- Describe the term "basal-bolus insulin regimen."
- · Describe methods to construct a "basal-bolus insulin regimen."
