2013-14 Fourth Attempt Appeal Process

State Rule **6A-14.0301**: A student may have only three (3) attempts per course including the original grade, repeat grades, and withdrawals at any point in the semester. A fourth attempt may be allowed only through an academic appeals process based on major extenuating circumstances.

<u>College-Level or Technical Credit Courses</u>: Students who request a fourth or subsequent attempt of the same course must go through an appeals process.

<u>Developmental Courses</u>: You will not be permitted to register for a fourth attempt in the same developmental course (preparatory courses). You will be advised to contact a public and/or private provider of developmental instruction to gain the required skill(s). Permission to register at Valencia for a fourth or subsequent attempt at a developmental course may be requested through this appeals process if you have a major extenuating circumstance.

Fourth Attempt (or First Appeal at Valencia*)

- 1. Students requesting fourth attempt of the same course (*for transfer students, this may be more than the fourth attempt, but it is their first appeal at Valencia) must submit a completed Appeal Application with supporting documentation. Failure to complete the application and supply all supporting documents will result in an automatic denial.
- 2. The Appeal Application must be submitted to the Dean of Students or their designee in the Student Services Office on any campus (see below) by the deadline.

4pm, December 13, 2013	For approval of Spring Term 2014 enrollment
4pm, April 25, 2014	For approval of Summer Term 2014 enrollment

- 5. The Appeal Application will be reviewed by the Deans of Students or their designee and approval decisions made based on the written documentation, the quality of the proposed Educational Success Plan, and a meeting with the student.
- 6. Please note: This approval process will <u>not</u> waive the Full Cost of Tuition requirement. In accordance with Sections 1009.22, 1004.93, 1009.28, and 1009.285, Florida Statutes, students enrolled in the same college-preparatory or college-level course at Valencia more than two times beginning Fall Term 1997 shall pay the full cost (100%) of instruction fee, except in approved cases of extenuating circumstances or financial hardship.
