The main themes discussed included supply, demand, product marketing, economics, and the organisation of key players to implement the New Caledonia Tourism Development Plan. The results of these efforts will be available during november 2005.

New Caledonia Nautilus take off to Aishi

Invited to the Aishi universal Exhibition, (in the Nagoya region of Japan), New Caledonia will be present from 26 August to 1st September on the France/Germany stand.

To illustrate, the theme of the exhibition, the "wisdom of nature" our destination has chosen to present the beauty and wealth of New Caledonia's biodiversity in an aquarium where multicoloured fish and nautilus will be the ambassadors of the world's largest lagoon. These creatures attracted a lot of attention when they travelled by plane on Aircalin. This true living fossil which has remained the same for 360 million years, the Nautilus Macromphalus, a cephalopod which is endemic to New Caledonia is not rare. However, because it lives at 150

to 600 metres, it is isolated from the divers' investigation zone.

The "Evasion" in Sarraméa

Situated at the base of the Dogny plateau amidst lush vegetation, the Evasion is a new tourist complex, scheduled to open in September 2005 in the pretty and dynamic region of Sarramea.

The hotel which has been built alongside a river on more than 6 hectares of garden, has 10 bungalows and 5 rooms with bathroom, bath, separate toilet, minibar, heating, air-conditioning, television (with satellite channel including music programmes in English and Japanese) and direct dial telephone. The

restaurant will offer French cuisine prepared with produce from a region known for its delicious fruit and vegetables, coffee and seafood. Theme evenings will be organised in the weekends. A sandwich bar will be available for hikers. Internet connection at reception.

For your relaxation : swimming pool, tennis, forest walks and hiking on the Dogny plateau, swimming in the river, pétanque, horseriding and quad biking.
