
Wew Meeting Schedule for 2009


County Manager, Peter Rascoe recognized each retiree individually and reminisced of his time working with each person and thanked them for their hard work and dedication.

BECOME A MASTER GARDENER!

Do you want to learn more about the culture of many types of plants? Are you eager to participate in and commit to a practical and intense training program? Do you look forward to sharing your knowledge with people in your community? Do you have enough time to attend training sessions and to serve as a committed volunteer?

If you answered yes to these questions, the Extension Master Gardener program could be for you!

WHO: The Chowan, Gates & Perquimans County NC Cooperative Extension Master Gardener Training Course

WHAT: Will be offered this fall. This course is offered every other year (next course 2011). The fee for the training is \$65. This covers a manual, name badge and light refreshments.

WHEN: Classes begin Tuesday, September 15 from 3pm to 6pm and continue for 14 weeks (every Tuesday)

WHERE: Classes will be taught at the Chowan County Agriculture Center in Edenton. Some field trips are involved.

WHY: The NC Extension Master Gardener program is an educational program designed to enhance public education in consumer horticulture. It provides educational assistance to the citizens of the county concerning lawns, fruits, vegetables, trees and ornamentals through the utilization of a trained and supervised volunteer staff.


IMPORTANT: Participants in the program must complete the training program, pass an examination and volunteer a minimum of 40 hours per year (20 hours in subsequent years) through the local Cooperative Extension Center.


Picture: Extension Master Gardeners encouraging landscaping with native plants at the Currituck County Flower & Garden Show.

BARROW ATTENDS NC SOIL & WATER WORKSHOP Submitted By: Sherry Harris


This year a Chowan County student of John A. Holmes high school will be attending the 2009 North Carolina Soil and Water Resource Conservation Workshop. Mathew Barrow, son of Billy and Vickie Barrow of Edenton will represent the Chowan Soil & Water District. This event is sponsored each summer by the NC Association of Soil and Water Districts. The workshop is held on the Campus of NC State University the week of June 21st through the 26th.

This is a week of intensive study, requiring student attention and participation in a wide range of conservation topics. The subjects covered during the weeklong workshop include soil characteristics, wildlife and fisheries management, forest management, non-agricultural uses for soils, water quality and watershed management. Along with class room studies most of the classes are outdoor field trips to various sites in the area. At the end of the week there is an examination and award ceremony which are usually college scholarships. The primary objective is learning about the natural resources and its management in today's environment.

The Chowan Soil and Water District office would like to thank the Chowan-Edenton Optimist Club for their contribution for Mathew's registration. Chowan County will be well represented by Mathew this year.




Mathew Barrow (center) receives a check from the Chowan-Edenton Optimist Club to attend the NC Soil & Water conservation workshop.








Summer Activities Schedule Now Available




