DECISION AND ORDER

By this Decision and Order, the commission vacates Order No. 21287, filed on September 7, 2004, in the matter of ISLAND PAGE, INC. ("Respondent").

I.

<u>History</u>

Pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules § 6-80-91 and Hawaii Revised Statutes § 269-30, the commission ordered Respondent to appear at 465 South King Street, Room B3, Honolulu, Hawaii 96813, at 9:00 a.m., on October 6, 2004, to show cause why Respondent's certificate of registration should not be suspended or revoked for failure to file its 2002 annual financial report ("AFR") by March 31, 2003, and pay its public utility fees ("Fees") that were due on July 31, 2003 and December 31, 2003.

On September 29, 2004, Respondent filed its 2002 AFR. On October 6, 2004, Respondent appeared at the above-referenced hearing and proposed a payment plan that would enable it to complete payment of its Fees to the commission. On March 10, 2005, the duly appointed hearings office issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Decision and Order of Hearings Officer. The hearings officer recommended that the commission adopt Respondent's proposed payment plan. On November 17, 2005, Respondent paid its final installment payment.

II.

Findings and Conclusions

The commission finds that Respondent has fully complied, although belatedly, with the commission's applicable laws, rules, and regulations, and concludes that Order No. 21287, filed on September 7, 2004, should be vacated.

III.

<u>Orders</u>

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. That Order No. 21287 is vacated.

2. This docket is closed unless otherwise ordered by the commission.
