HOUSE MOVING

There are two (2) building permits required in order to move a house to a property. The first permit you will need is a Moving Permit. This permit gets reviewed by a Planning Technician and then the permit will be issued by a Permit Technician. The second permit is a Foundation Permit. This permit also gets reviewed by a Planning Technician and then has to go through a plan review process before it gets permitted by a Permit Technician.

Submittal Requirements Checklist for Moving Permit:

1.	Property Appraiser property tax information. Property Property Appraiser property tax information.
2.	Fully completed Building Permit Application. The application must be fully completed, signed, and notarized.
3.	A copy of a certified survey or site plan.
Submittal Requirements Checklist for Foundation Permit: Note: This permit can be purchased by either a licensed Residential, Building or General Contractor.	
1.	<u>Proof of property ownership</u> . This can be a recorded deed, closing statement, or property tax information.
2.	Two sets of construction plans. The construction plans must be certified, signed, and sealed by a Florida-registered design professional (architect or engineer).
3.	Building Permit Application. The application must be fully completed, signed, and notarized.
4.	Three copies of a certified survey or site plan.
5.	<u>Proof of water and sewer.</u> This can be obtained from the water/sewer service provider for the area where the building will be located. Proof can be in the form of tap fee receipts. For buildings on septic tanks, a copy of the approved septic tank permit issued by the Okaloosa County Health Department is required.
6.	<u>Fire impact receipt</u> . A receipt showing that the fire impact fee has been paid. <i>This is required only for <u>new</u> construction</i> .
7.	Two sets of completed Energy Forms. These can be obtained from the electric service provider, a mechanical contractor, or similar agency.
8.	Planned Unit Development (PUD) approval. A letter of approval from the PUD unified controller will be required <u>if</u> the home will be located in a PUD.
9.	Two copies of Completed Product Approval Sheet (Microsoft Excel) or (PDF). This is a list of components and products that will be used to build the structure

- 10. <u>Elevation Certificate</u>. (If property is located in a special flood hazard area) A total of 2 elevation certificates certified by a Florida-registered surveyor or mapper are required during the construction of the home:
 - a. One prior to obtaining your permit (Construction Drawings).
 - b. One after construction is complete (Finished Construction).

The Finished Construction elevation certificate is required prior to final inspection. The construction drawings elevation certificate submitted with the permit application *must* include the comments about location of utilities and equipment.

NOTE: You may be required to submit a *certified Foundation Survey* prepared by a Florida registered land survey.

*Some circumstances may require additional information to be submitted prior to a development permit being issued.
